#### **Back to Ordinary Time**

After a couple of Sundays of special Feast Days that took the place of our normal Sunday Liturgies, we are back to the Ordinary Time. We are drawing close to the end of the Liturgical Year. Advent will begin on November 30 this year. All that remains of Ordinary Time are this Sunday and the next. On November 23 we will celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The end of the year each of the three year cycles features glimpses of the end. This week in our Gospel, Jesus talks about the future, filled with challenges, suffering, and persecution. The call at the end of this list of coming dangers is a vital word for us to keep always before us: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." In other years, we hear Jesus say, Stay awake! Be alert! This year, we hear the call for us to persevere in the faith, come what may . . . come whatever may. That is what we all of us in any circumstance can do. Concerns about what's happening in the world or even in the Church often cause anxiety, which the Lord warns against, saying "Be not afraid." We are tempted to attempt to control events in our homes, in our workplaces, in schools, in communities, in our state, our nation, and the world. And there is no doubt that we should have a concern about those things. But we often focus too much on the "Sphere of Concern" and not as much as the Lord would have us focus on our "Sphere of Influence." About matters outside of our control we should care, of course. But we often care too much about those things. Caring too much can (and often does) lead to us losing our peace (and often our sleep). The Lord invites us to trust Him, and, as St. John XXIII was reported to have said at the end of each day, "It's your Church. I've done what I can. Now I'm going to sleep." Let's do what we can, focusing on how to love well, and entrust everything and everyone we care about (throughout and especially at the end of each day) to God and to Our Lady. God "has this," whatever our particular "this" is. We do best to trust that He is a Good Father, and He asks that we only do what we can do, by grace and our cooperation therewith. Let us be prayerful and attentive to the Lord's leading, the Spirit's promptings, and the Father's Will. Come, Holy Spirit!

#### **Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3)**

Thank you to all who have already prayed about their gift and those who have made a gift/pledge to the campaign. I've made a gift/pledge myself, and would be happy to answer any questions any of you might have about the campaign, its purposes and goals, and our part in the campaign. As I've mentioned before, I don't want anyone to feel coerced into giving, but I do

invite all of us to prayerfully consider the goals of the campaign, and follow the Lord's leading with regard to a potential gift. As I've mentioned before, the letter from the bishop with a particular amount that you are being asked to give is an aspirational amount, rather than an expectation. Some will be able (and choose) to give that amount, some may discern that they are called to give less. Some may feel called to give more than the amount requested. A few of you have already told me that you (and your families) are unable to give or pledge anything more than your committed giving at this time. Be assured of this: I respect your discernment. I simply merely ask everyone to prayerfully consider the elements of the campaign, and then respond to the Lord's leading. (Thanks in advance!) Should you not have received a letter, you can get a pledge card from Sarah Michaels at the parish office. One final note: If you haven't seen the video for the S3 campaign yet, it's quite good. 


#### St. Gerard Thanksgiving Dinner
