Happy New Year!

As we celebrate the new (liturgical) year and begin our Advent journey, I hope and pray that all of our hearts will be filled with joyful anticipation of Christ's three-fold coming: 1) His coming as a baby, the "Newborn King"; 2) His coming again in Glory; and 3) His coming into our hearts. Each day of Advent, let us prepare for His coming by inviting Him into our hearts, so that our hearts might be filled with love, joy, and peace.

The Heavenly Liturgy

When we come to Mass, we are invited into a tremendous mystery, a holy and awe-inspiring entry into the heavenly realms. In the Sacred Liturgy, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, heaven, as it were, comes to earth. The more our celebration of the Mass can be beautiful, reverent, and mysterious, the more we (and our children) will sense that the Mass is anything but "ordinary." Especially in this Holy Season, we will seek to focus on sacred silence and a more simple musical setting at Mass. The point is to be drawn into mystery when we celebrate the Mass. Consider, in this context, the vision of heaven John describes in the Book of Revelation:

Then I saw standing in the midst of the throne and the four living creatures and the elders, a Lamb that seemed to have been slain He came and received the scroll from the right hand of the one who sat on the throne. When he took it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each of the elders held a harp and gold bowls filled with incense, which are the prayers of the holy ones. They sang a new hymn: "Worthy are you to receive the scroll and to break open its seals, for you were slain and with your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue, people and nation. You made them a kingdom and priests for our God, and they will reign on earth."

I looked again and heard the voices of many angels who surrounded the throne and the living creatures and the elders. They were countless in number, and they cried out in a loud voice: "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing." Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, everything in the universe, cry out: "To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever." The four living creatures answered, "Amen," and the elders fell down and worshiped. (Revelation 5:6-14)

Ouiet at the End of Mass

As a reminder, please use "library/church voices" if you talk after Mass, so that those who wish to make a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass can do that. I say it often, but I love that we like each other, and desire to fellowship and catch up with each other on Sundays. Please be mindful of others, though, as you do so! Thank you.

Wrapping Up Stewardship for Saints and Scholars

The active phase of our local campaign wraps up today, but through the end of the year, feel free to prayerfully discern a gift, and turn the pledge form in or fill out the online gift/pledge on the S3 campaign. Thanks again to all those who have given or pledged to the campaign. Every dollar raised is a dollar that will be used for the purposes of the campaign. Thank you for prayerfully discerning your gift, and responding to the Lord's promptings. I'll give you updated figures on how we did next Sunday. (There are pledge cards in the pews this week. Are You Ready? He's Coming!


The Lord is someday (perhaps soon!) coming again. Indeed, *Advent* means "coming." Today, Jesus says the following:


Stewardship for Saints and Scholars


