

Hearts Filled with Joy

On this *Gaudete Sunday*, my heart is filled with joy for God's goodness to us this year. Thank you for your prayerful support of our ministry, and your commitment to spiritual growth, spreading the Gospel, and ministering to those in need. The Lord has blessed us richly, and I hope and pray that we will continue to grow in our ability to worship God well, grow in holiness, and serve others in love, as we enjoy the new year in our Lord's favor. We light the rose candle and I wear rose vestments, as we celebrate that the Lord is drawing nearer. Come, Lord Jesus!

Rorate Mass December 17th at 7:00 a.m.

This Wednesday morning at 7:00 a.m., we will celebrate a special Rorate Mass by candlelight in addition to our normal Masses. The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. The interplay of light and darkness speaks to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world. The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate, Caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem." "Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Savior."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter. illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord. We will have our usual 6:00 p.m. Mass Wednesday evening, followed by confessions and Benediction.

Ember Days

A few years ago, we handed out copies of *Eat, Fast, Feast*, which describes the spiritual benefits of fasting. One of the way to mark the changing of the seasons, and to prepare for the Feasting of various times of the year is through the celebration of "Ember Days." Fr. John Hardon S.J. wrote the following entry in his *Modern Catholic Dictionary*:

Three days set apart for fasting, abstinence, and prayer during each of the four seasons of the year. They were the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday after St. Lucy (or Lucia, d. 304) (December 13), the First Sunday of Lent, Pentecost, and the feast of the Holy Cross (September 14). Since the revision of the Roman calendar in 1969, Ember Days are to be observed at the discretion of the National Conference of Bishops. Moreover, their observance may be extended beyond three days and even repeated during the year. Possibly occasioned by the agricultural feasts of ancient Rome, they came to be observed by Christians for the sanctification of the different seasons of the year, and for obtaining God's blessing on the clergy to be ordained during the Embertides. (Etym. Anglo-Saxon oemerge, ashes.)

One way to remember when the Ember Days are is a little rhyme that specifies the four times per year we're invited to fast: "Lenty, Penty, Crucy, Lucy." (Lent, Pentecost, the Exaltation of the Cross, and St. Lucy.) Though we are no longer bound to these periods of fasting, practicing them is helpful to our preparation for Christmas, and to our growth as Christians. The minimal guidelines according to the 1962 norms are as follows:

- One day of fasting with partial abstinence on Wednesday
- One day of fasting with complete abstinence on Friday
- A third day of fasting with partial abstinence on Ember Saturday

I encourage us, as possible, to mark these days by fast and abstinence. The more we fast, the more celebratory Feasts become.

Extraordinary Form Night Prayer (12/14 at 8:00 p.m.) This evening, we will conclude the weekend by praying *Compline*. There will be a musical prelude at 8:00, and we will conclude around 8:45. Come, join us and pray in the week. It's a beautiful time of prayer and song.

Communal Penance Service

Today (Sunday, December 14), there is a communal penance service at St. Thomas Aquinas at 1:30 p.m. Our "Lansing North" group of parishes will have a combined communal penance service on Monday evening, December 15th. It will be held at St. Therese (102 N. Randolph, Lansing, MI 48906) and will begin at 7:00 p.m. If that date and time doesn't work for you, you can check "masstimes.org" to find local area confession times or check our website for times here. Let's prepare well for Christ's coming.

Cooks are responsible for preparing and cooking food for events on site and supervising serving staff. Scheduling is flexible.




