We are grateful to be able to partner with LCHS, and ask for God's continued blessings upon the excellent team the Lord has called to serve us and families from around the Lansing area. What was originally "Gabriels High School" is still *our Catholic High School*. Not just ours, of course. It draws from all the area parishes.

Because this is Catholic Schools Week, we will add morning Masses on Tuesday and Wednesday at 8:15 a.m.

The Lord Calls

Today in the Gospel, we hear Jesus calling his first apostles. The Lord is still calling men, women, boys, and girls today. All of us are called to live lives of holiness and love, but some of us are called to the priesthood or religious life. I want to encourage all of you to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, and to help us form a culture of openness to self-gift in the form of priesthood and religious life. We have presently four young men who are in formation for the priesthood and religious life, and I give God thanks for them. Thomas Crowley, who is studying in Rome, is scheduled to be ordained to the transitional diaconate this coming October 1. Mason Abbott is in his second year of theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. Charlie Gates is in his third year of formation at St. John Vianney Seminary in St. Paul. Joseph Crowley is a novice with the Holy Cross Fathers in Colorado. I know of at least one more young man who is discerning a call, and I hope that we will continue to have young men consider the priesthood, and

young men and women consider the Religious Life. God calls. May we be open to hear!

St. John Vianney on Priesthood

Go to confession to the Blessed Virgin, or to an angel; will they absolve you? No. Will they give you the Body and Blood of Our Lord? No. The Holy Virgin cannot make her Divine Son descend into the Host. You might have two hundred angels there, but they could not absolve you. A priest, however simple he may be, can do it; he can say to you, "Go in peace; I pardon you. " Oh, how great is a priest! The priest will not understand the greatness of his office till he is in Heaven. If he understood it on earth, he would die, not of fear, but of love. The other benefits of God would be of no avail to us without the priest.

And here's a second quote from St. John Vianney's *Catechism of the Priesthood*: *Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.*

Openness to Vocations

Brothers (young and not-so-young), if you sense that the Lord might be calling you to prayerfully consider a vocation to the priesthood, I would love to talk and pray with you about that. The priesthood has been a great gift and joy to me, and I'd love to share my experience with you.
