Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Procession (February 2)

This year, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord falls on Monday. This Feast is the 40th day since Christmas, and is when we recall Mary and Joseph coming to Jerusalem to present Jesus after the days of Mary's ritual purification were completed. It was a day of profound joy for Mary and Joseph, as well as both Anna and Simeon, two faithful Israelites who were awaiting the coming of the Messiah. Today, we call to mind the beautiful light that Christ represents, especially as He came to Jerusalem. This day is often called "Candlemas," because candles are blessed for use in church and in homes. This Monday, we will celebrate the Feast beginning with a procession that will commence in the school gym. I will announce this shortly before the 8:15 a.m. Mass to those gathered, but we will process out the gym and then into the church. (Those who remain can get their tapers lit by those who come in procession. We process with candles to remind us of the great privilege we have to be bearers of the Light of Christ. May we welcome Jesus, and recall the profound privilege of being, in Christ, "Lights for the World.")

Tuesday, the Memorial of St. Blaise, we will have Mass at 8:15 a.m., at which throats will be blessed. Join us, if you'd like. By the way, we have a relic of St. Blaise in our altar. St. Blaise, pray for us!

Diocesan-Wide Survey Begins February 17

As we did three years ago and two years before that, every adult in parishes across the diocese are invited to complete an online (or paper) survey called "Disciple-Maker Index." This instrument was developed by the Catholic Leadership Institute as part of a Lilly Foundation grant-funded program to understand parish life from a leadership perspective. This survey will provide helpful data to assess the current climate and health of the diocese (and parishes in the diocese). We will get data comparing our parish with others in the diocese, and with national averages. The survey includes Mass attendance, spiritual disciplines, and beliefs. Responses to the survey questions will be confidential. The survey will take 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and the results will be invaluable to me, the staff, and our many volunteers as we seek ways to best support everyone in their discipleship journey. I look forward to sharing the findings with you when the project is complete. This time, the diocese is planning to use these results as part of a summary of the state of the diocese, for use by Bishop Boyea's successor, whenever he may be named. (Bishop Boyea will tender his letter of resignation, as he is required to do, in April when he turns 75.)

Lenten Fish Boils

Ash Wednesday is February 18 this year. Last year, we tried out the concept of Friday Fish Dinners, and it was a resounding success. We are planning to hold Fish Boils again this year on Fridays of Lent (excluding March 13 and Good Friday, which is April 3). We are (obviously) going to need a crew of volunteers to help us pull this off. It was a great opportunity for fellowship and a healthier option to Fish Fries. Mark your calendars now, and please consider signing up on our website for some service times (sign-up coming soon). If you would be willing to join the Fish Dinner Team, please reach out to Sarah Michaels, and she'll put you in touch with Jim and Piper Fountain, who are organizing things again this year.
