### Sermon on the Mount

Last Sunday, we began the Sermon on the Mount. We'll have this weekend and next to continue through Matthew Chapter 5, with Jesus most comprehensive sermon in the scriptures. We began last week with the Beatitudes, which, as I mentioned in my homily, are at the heart of what our lives ought to reflect when we pursue true happiness and the Kingdom of God. In my homily, I shared these reflections from a commentary on the Gospel of Matthew by Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis. The series is entitled, *Fire of Mercy, Heart of the Word*. Here are his comments on the first beatitude, which reads: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."

*The First Beatitude 5:3 (μακάριοι οἱ πτωχοὶ τῷ πνεύματι ὅτι αὐτῶν ἐστὶν ἡ βασιλεία τῶν οὐρανῶν) How fortunate the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.*

*WE MAY TRANSLATE more graphically: 'How fortunate those who beg for their life's very breath!' At once we recall the deer of Psalm 41[42]:1f., which in its race for the springs of water stops an instant to regain its breath. Thus it is that "my soul pants for you, O Lord." And in Psalm 38 [39]:10 we exclaim: "All my longing, Lord, lies open before you. My sighing is not hid from you." Panting and sighing for God with one's life-breath is the whole occupation of "those of humble breath". What Jesus here intends is most likely not a neatly spiritualized attitude of interior detachment, but an existence (πνεῦμα: one's very breath, each moment we inhale air) wholly dependent upon God's mercy and providence. The Lord Jesus puts at the head of his praises those who do not forget that their life, like the Hebrew alphabet, must always begin with α the soundless letter aleph; that is, before we can say anything we must take in breath, take in air from outside ourselves. "My mouth I opened and drew in breath, because I yearned for your commands" (Ps 118[119]:131). We depend on God in the same way that our lungs and our voice depend on air. Speaking is the controlled vibration produced on the vocal chords by the air we exhale after first having inhaled it, without its being ours. Air is like grace, the sine qua non of our life and very existence.*

*To be thus radically dependent, to long for God in this way, is declared to be the greatest fortune and bliss. To cling to God with one's whole being and have nothing to offer of one's own is the highest fulfillment and ecstasy.* Leiva-Merikakis, Erasmo. *Fire of Mercy, Heart of the Word: Meditations on the Gospel According to St. Matthew* (pp. 220-221). ### Salt and Light

Last week, we recalled the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, and Simeon's canticle reminds us that Jesus, the baby who was presented in the Temple, is the "light for revelation to the Gentiles," and He is that today through you and me. We are called and graced to be Salt and Light in our world. We are called to live, as Simeon said of Jesus as a sign of contradiction to the world. We are living our temporal life with the grace to manifest here the realities of the eternal life we have received from God through our baptism. May we never shrink from being compelling

witnesses in our world, come what may, come whatever may. We are a "preservative" and we are the light. Let us live in ways that preserve and improve our homes, communities, and our world. Come, Holy Spirit!

### Diocesan-Wide Survey Begins February 17

As we did three years ago and two years before that, every adult in parishes across the diocese are invited to complete an online (or paper) survey called "Disciple-Maker Index." This instrument was developed by the Catholic Leadership Institute as part of a Lilly Foundation grant-funded program to understand parish life from a leadership perspective. This survey will provide helpful data to assess the current climate and health of the diocese (and parishes in the diocese). We will get data comparing our parish with others in the diocese, and with national averages. The survey includes Mass attendance, spiritual disciplines, and beliefs. Responses to the survey questions will be confidential. The survey will take 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and the results will be invaluable to me, the staff, and our many volunteers as we seek ways to best support everyone in their discipleship journey. I look forward to sharing the findings with you when the project is complete. This time, the diocese is planning to use these results as part of a summary of the state of the diocese, for use by Bishop Boyea's successor, whenever he may be named. (Bishop Boyea will tender his letter of resignation, as he is required to do, in April when he turns 75.)

### Lenten Fish Boils

Ash Wednesday is February 18 this year. Last year, we tried out the concept of Friday Fish Dinners, and it was a resounding success. We are planning to hold Fish Boils again this year on Fridays of Lent (excluding March 13 and Good Friday, which is April 3). We are (obviously) going to need a crew of volunteers to help us pull this off. It was a great opportunity for fellowship and a healthier option to Fish Fries. Mark your calendars now, and please consider signing up on our website for some service times. If you would be willing to join the Fish Dinner Team, please reach out to Sarah Michaels, and she'll put you in touch with Jim and Piper Fountain, who are organizing things again this year.

### Come Encounter Jesus February 21

Normally, our bi-monthly *Healing Encounter* is held on the second Saturday of even months, which falls on February 14 this year. We have postponed that to February 21<sup>st</sup> this year. The *Healing Encounter* is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in the church. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. Come, and bring others with you. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.
