Ascension of the Lord

Jesus is Risen from the dead! For forty days, he appeared to the believers and encouraged them in their belief. He desires to encourage us in our belief as well. The testimony of the Risen One is as relevant to our world today as it was in the first century. Today, in the Acts of the Apostles, we read, *While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." And, ". . . you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* Celebrating the Ascension, we now wait, with the entire Church, to "receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon [us]."

Spreading the Good News

Last Sunday, I preached in part about this exhortation from St. Peter: "Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope . . ." Indeed, we are to live intentionally as Christians, acting as if (for it is true) Jesus was

intentions for us, and longs for us to follow him, day by day, and to grow in our life in Christ as disciples, as students or apprentices of the Master. To the extent that we live as Jesus would have us live, we will live differently from those around us. It doesn't have to be a "loud" difference, but it will be noticed nonetheless. That is, if we are living conspicuously Christian lives. We are called, as Jesus was, to be a sign of contradiction in our world. As we live loving, holy lives, others will wonder what's going on with us. They might ask us why we are at peace when so many are so concerned about the future. They may wonder why we don't join them in their carousing or gossip or whatever. They might even ask us why we have hope in dark times. St. Peter tells us to be prepared for just such questions, to share that we are believers in Jesus, and that He has given us a great commission to spread the Good News, as we hear in today's Gospel: *Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."* We are commanded to spread the Good News, and the Good News is not merely information about how to be saved; it is the grace to "observe all that [Jesus has] commanded [us]." The Lord wants us to know the truth, but most of all He wants us to live in the truth and share the truth with others. In 2026, many people are primed to look for something more substantive and real than the virtual world that is drawing them into itself, without the satisfaction of real relationships. We Christians are in touch with not just reality but the author of reality, the ground of all being. Living that way will help us retain peace in uncertain times, love when others are hating so much, and live in freedom when so many are enslaved. Life in Christ, empowered by the Spirit, is attractive. Let's live it, and share it with others.

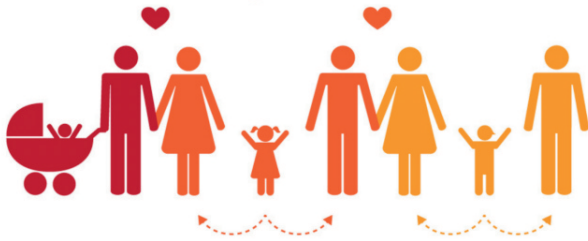
