As I've said more than a few times over the past years, "Come, Holy Spirit" is a prayer that the Holy Spirit can't resist. He comes! May we be those who open our hearts to receive with an open heart, mind, and will the power of the Holy Spirit.

"Surpassing Greatness of His Power . . ."

Last week, we heard from Paul's letter to the Ephesians the following words: *May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones, and what is the surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe . . .* For us! Each and every one of us.

We All Are Vital for God's Work

Last Sunday, I read a reflection by St. John Henry Newman that I regularly cite when reflecting on the importance of the gifts that each and every one of us has been given by God. The enemy and world gets us to compare ourselves to one another, which often leads to envy or pride. The Lord, on the other hand, desires that we be grateful for our own gifts (and use them) and for others' gifts as well. The Enemy, the Liar, Diabolos, is always trying to get us to believe lies about ourselves. These reflections of St. John Henry Newman are worth meditation, especially when anyone is wondering why they exist and what they are called to be and do. Please do pray with these reflections from St. John Henry Newman's Meditations and Devotions:

1. God was all-complete, all-blessed in Himself; but it was His will to create a world for His glory. He is Almighty, and might have done all things Himself, but it has been His will to bring about His purposes by the beings He has created. We are all created to His glory—we are created to do His will. I am created to do something or to be something for which no one else is created; I have a place in God's counsels, in God's world, which no one else has; whether I be rich or poor, despised or esteemed by man, God knows me and calls me by my name.

2. God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission—I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his . . . I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

3. Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers, He may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me—still He knows what He is about.

O Adonai, O Ruler of Israel, Thou that guidest Joseph like a flock, O Emmanuel, O Sapientia, I give myself to Thee. I trust Thee wholly. Thou art wiser than I—more loving to me than I myself. Deign to fulfil Thy high purposes in me whatever they be—work in and through me. I am born to serve Thee, to be Thine, to be Thy instrument. Let me be Thy blind instrument. I ask not to see—I ask not to know—I ask simply to be used.

We are, indeed, God's chosen ones with a purpose that the Lord longs for us to fulfill, for our sake and that of others in the world. May we be witnesses in power of the Holy Spirit's transforming grace!
