Reflections on Ordinations

Last Sunday, I reflected on the conjunction of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*) and the ordination of four men to the priesthood and two to the transitional diaconate. (As I mentioned, the third in next year's priestly ordination class, Thomas Crowley, will be ordained, God willing, on October 1st this year in Rome. You can join us for a pilgrimage to be there for that and much more, if you'd like. See below for more information.) The "yes" of those men and the recent reminder of the promises that I made at my own ordinations to the diaconate (November 20, 2004) and to the priesthood (June 11, 2005) were an invitation to prayer and reflection on the life of ministry the Lord has given me.

Join Us for Thomas's Ordination

Thomas Crowley just finished his third year of studies as a seminarian at the North American College in Rome and will be ordained to the transitional diaconate on October 1, 2026 at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Bishop Robert Barron will be the ordaining bishop for Thomas and his classmates. We have about fourteen spots left in the group that I will be leading, which will include Rome and the Shrines of Italy. It's going to be a great trip. Fr. Vincent Richardson will be joining the trip, fittingly, as another son of the parish, to be there for the ordination and the pilgrimage. The trip is going to be wonderful. If you are interested, please let me know. We hope to get the trip filled up by the middle of July, if possible. You can get information about the pilgrimage on our website. There are also fliers in the church.

Fourteen Years at Resurrection

Fourteen years ago, Fr. Mark Rutherford and I were assigned to the Church of the Resurrection. He was assigned as an Associate Pastor here because I was then also the Superintendent of Schools. It was wonderful to minister with him, and to come to this historic and life-giving parish. As I do fairly regularly, but this year a bit early, I reprint what I wrote in the first bulletin article I wrote in 2012, when I was first assigned here. I share it with you now, and you will see that it remains a work-in-progress. Please pray for me and our team as we anticipate the next year of formation, and desire to please God in our ministry and fruitfulness as a parish community. Thank you! Here are some excerpts from my first bulletin article:

Encountering Christ

My priesthood has been marked by a strong desire to help others encounter Christ in a powerful, life-changing way. I am thankful for the long legacy of evangelization, discipleship, and service that has the strong foundation that has been established here. Together, let us prayerfully labor to make our parish an even more effective place of genuine encounter with the Love of God.

God is Love

*I take these words of Pope Benedict XVI, from his first encyclical, *Deus Caritas Est*, as a principle that informs my ministry as pastor and Superintendent of Catholic schools: "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction Since God has first loved us (cf. I Jn 4:10), love is now no longer a mere 'command'; it is the response to the gift of love with which God draws near to us." As I see things, our response to this gift of God's love is to strive, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to help others encounter the One who is Love, the One who "draws near to us." As a parish, I hope and pray that together we will strive to grow in our love of God and neighbor and to share that love with others.*

First Things First

The ground of encounters with Christ is tilled and fertilized by prayer. Prayer must begin, sustain, and be the end of all our efforts. As Fr. Mark and I begin our service here, we are resolved to continue the strong legacy of prayer at this parish and school. As we move forward, may Resurrection parish (and school) be even more widely known as a place of prayer, a house of prayer, a school of prayer. If that happens, then our various apostolates—our school, the hospital, ministry to the young and old, and especially to the "least of these"—will radiate our witness in this city that so desperately needs Jesus.

Still Striving

Let's keep praying for God's guidance as we seek to be salt, light, and leaven in our homes, schools, workplaces, parish, and world. And let's keep praying for one another and for those most in need. Amen.
