Catechism on Citizenship

As I mentioned last week, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* outlines "duties of citizenship" that are worth reflection as we celebrate 250 years and in a time when many are seemingly very hostile to the Founders and the Nation they established. As I've mentioned more than once, our nation is imperfect, but it is the freest nation on earth, in terms of fundamental human rights. We can (and should) work to improve the fulfillment of the promises made in the founding documents. Let us pray for wisdom for the Body Politic, as we experience another political season, here in Michigan and around the country. Here are the quotes I shared on Sunday:

The duties of citizens

2238 *Those subject to authority should regard those in authority as representatives of God, who has made them stewards of his gifts:43 "Be subject for the Lord's sake to every human institution.... Live as free men, yet without using your freedom as a pretext for evil; but live as servants of God."44 (1 Peter 2) Their loyal collaboration includes the right, and at times the duty, to voice their just criticisms of that which seems harmful to the dignity of persons and to the good of the community. (1900)*

2239 *It is the duty of citizens to contribute along with the civil authorities to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom. The love and service of one's country follow from the duty of gratitude and belong to the order of charity. Submission to legitimate authorities and service of the common good require citizens to fulfill their roles in the life of the political community. (1915, 2310)*

2240 *Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country: (2265, 1900)*

Pay to all of them their dues, taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honor to whom honor is due. (Romans 13:7)

The Apostle exhorts us to offer prayers and thanksgiving for kings and all who exercise authority, "that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life, godly and respectful in every way." I Tim 2:2

The Catechism continues, addressing an issue that has been fraught in our nation, that of immigration. It seems worth reflection, as well:

2241 *The more prosperous nations are obliged, to the extent they are able, to welcome the foreigner in search of the security and the means of livelihood which he cannot find in his country of origin. Public authorities should see to it that the natural right is respected that places a guest under the protection of those who receive him.*

Political authorities, for the sake of the common good for which they are responsible, may make the exercise of the right to immigrate subject to various juridical conditions, especially with regard to the immigrants' duties toward their country of adoption. Immigrants are obliged to respect with gratitude the material and spiritual heritage of the country that receives them, to obey its laws and to assist in carrying civic burdens.

We Catholics should always be of a mind to see what the Church has said about matters, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church is a great resource for us. I hope that all of you have a copy (or have access to it). The Church lays out the morality of these issues, but the duty to establish policies is not in the purview of the bishops or the Church, but of politicians. That is why we need to pray for our leaders and encourage good men and women to consider serving the nation in political life. Come, Holy Spirit!
