The Gift of the Priesthood

Last Sunday, I mentioned my own vocation story, of finding, as it were, the pearl of the priesthood within the Pearl of Great Price, and a treasure (again, of the priesthood) within the field of the Great Treasure. I definitely want to encourage young (and not-so-young) men to prayerfully discern whether the Lord might be calling them to the priesthood. We have four young men studying for the priesthood and discerning religious life, and I'm grateful for their "yes" to the discernment process. As you know, they are Thomas Crowley, who will be, God-willing, ordained to the transitional diaconate on October 1; Mason Abbott, who will be entering his third year of major seminary this fall; Charlie Gates, who will be a senior at St. John Vianney College Seminary at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, MN; and Joseph Crowley, who is a Novice with the Holy Cross Fathers, studying in Colorado Springs. Please pray for them. Thank you!

Memorial of St. John Vianney

This Tuesday is the feast day of parish priests, as we celebrate St. John Vianney. He wrote a *Catechism on the Priesthood*. Here is a powerful excerpt that underscores points I made last week in my homily: *Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.*

Priest Discernment Retreat (August 4-6, 2026)

This retreat, which runs from Tuesday, August 4 (Memorial of St. John Vianney) at dinner through Thursday morning, August 6, is a chance for men to learn more about the discernment process and meet men who are already in priestly formation, ask questions about the life and ministry of a priest, and provide an opportunity to experience the camaraderie of other the discerners. Fr. Mike Cassar, Director of Seminarians, and Fr. Ryan Riley, Pastor of St. Martha's in Okemos, will provide direction

on the discernment process, give their reflections on the priesthood, and answer questions. Small group discussions will be led by priests of the Diocese of Lansing. Daily Mass and the opportunity for Confession and Adoration will be offered. Rooms are private with a shared bathroom. The suggested donation is \$100, but SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE. Multiplication of the Loaves

This Sunday, we read Matthew's account of the Feeding of the 5000. All four gospels recount the multiplication of the loaves, and Matthew has this one and another that follows in Chapter 15, where he recounts the Feeding of the 4000. These reveal that Jesus cares about every aspect of our lives, including that we are fed. The simple narrative, which is not embellished in any of the four accounts, has a historicity that is compelling. This really happened! Jesus took the little and multiplied the loaves and the fish. He takes it, blesses it, breaks it, and gives it. The Eucharistic overtones could not be clearer. Jesus gives us in the Eucharist (through the ministry of the priest) His very Self, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. May we look to Him, and pray every day for our daily bread, that we might more fully and effectively grow in love in Him.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is an international Catholic lay organization dedicated to serving the poor and suffering through person-to-person support. In the Lansing area, local chapters (or conferences) provide critical emergency aid such as food, clothing, housing costs, and furniture.

The Beginnings of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul

In 1833, Frederic Ozanam and five fellow college students met and founded a group that later became the St. Vincent de Paul Society. The group's purpose was to assist the poor during the political, social, religious, and economic turmoil of early 19th century France. This Catholic lay organization was intended to help its members increase in holiness by providing loving service to those

in need. In 1845, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul established roots in the United States.

St. Vincent de Paul at Resurrection Church

The Resurrection SVdP Chapter has been around since the late 1950s, serving families in the geographic area surrounding the parish. We are staffed by volunteers (and will welcome new volunteers!). We offer support for the neighbors in our area, including bags of food each month for those who request it. We also provide non-food assistance in the form of vouchers for clothing, furniture, and household goods from the SVdP thrift store on South Washington Avenue. We also provide financial assistance, sometimes partnering with other SVdP chapters, for rent and other needs. Included here is the information about who we served for the first half of the year. We can only do this because of your generosity of cash donations and through your participation in the Meijer Simply Give card program. Thank you!
