ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

The phrase *Unleash the Gospel* refers to Archbishop Vigneron's 2017 Pastoral letter, as the result of a year of prayer to the Holy Spirit and Synod 16, as well as a movement to change the "DNA" or the culture of the Archdiocese in Southeast Michigan and moving parishes from "maintenance to mission" so we all become effective witnesses to the Gospel. The letter is our roadmap. The action of the Holy Spirit in our lives and parishes is the movement!

Each parish in the AoD will create a bold, actionable and concrete plan to bring the focus, mission and action steps of Unleash the Gospel (UTG) into the life of each parish. These action steps, or synod propositions, focus on families, parish life and culture, and support of Catholic education (whether a parish has a school or not).

Last summer Our Lady Star of the Sea was one of the 9 "partner parishes" in the Archdiocese of Detroit to participate in developing a Missionary Strategic Plan incorporating the 6 synod (MSP) propositions. The "parish visioning night" was very helpful in formulation of our MSP. Overall, the 9 week process was challenging but most fruitful and productive! Just like other organizations, it is our action plan for the next 3-5 years as the result of our parish praying to the Holy Spirit for six months last year at Sunday Mass and in our personal prayer. Let me share this week our goals regarding the Family Synod Proposition, i.e., "Envision and develop a practical plan for ongoing formation and spiritual formation for all the stages of life."

Goal #1: OLSOS will expand the pastoral staff to focus on increasing faith in families of all ages. We will do this by hiring a Director of Family Ministry. #2: We will work on increasing the faith in families of all ages by providing more



information and instruction regarding "the domestic church" which is the family. This can be accomplished through various resources and tools including events for families. #3: We also hope to provide married couples and young families with pastoral support through the Director of Family Ministry. #4: We also plan to assist the senior population through our personal or small group outreach through various events or gathering geared toward their needs. #5: We also plan to have more connecting points with our youth in college. #6: Finally, various events or venues of faith and fun will be designed to bring people in to our community.

I will continue to share the other goals of our MSP over the next weeks. I am happy to say that the work and effort of Star of the Sea's MSP, and that of another partner parish, is being noted as a model by the Archdiocese for the other 210 parishes when they begin their MSP process over the next 3 years. The past three weekend's gospel accounts remind us that Jesus invites us into his mission to spread the Good News to those around us. That is what we are about: responding to the call of Jesus, as a parish community and as individuals, to be sent on mission!

** I invite all of you to come to our monthly "holy hour" on Monday night at 7:30 pm. Allow the time to relax in the Lord's presence, give Him all your praise and petitions, and know His great love for you!



** Following the tragedy of Kobe Bryant I found it pretty awesome to hear that his Catholic faith was most important to him, especially a few years back when he was embroiled with life relationship issues. Last Sunday he and his family participated in Sunday Mass at his parish before

leaving with his daughter on their tragic flight. In this day and age when sports, especially youth sports, are often the stated reason why families do not participate in Sunday Mass, it is inspiring that such a respected sports celebrity found the Catholic Church and her sacraments to be essential to family life.

Sunday of the Word of God

Today we hear from Luke's Gospel because of the feast of the Presentation of the Lord, but normally this liturgical year we hear from Matthew's Gospel. God in his goodness and the Church in her wisdom give us plenty to feast upon when we hear the Scriptures proclaimed in the Liturgy of the Word.

The Gospel: Our Sunday Gospels follow a 3 year cycle. Matthew's Gospel is known for his sermon on the mount (which we will begin hearing from next week) which portrays Jesus as the new Moses, going up the mountain to teach and deliver the law of the new covenant. We pray Matthew's version the Our Father at Mass. In Christian art, Matthew is often portrayed as the human face, using imagery associated with each Evangelist from the prophet Ezekiel (1:10) and the Book of Revelation (4:7).

The First Reading: While the Gospel readings follow a sequence from week to week, unique Old Testament readings are paired with each Gospel. Sometimes the reason is easy to discern, and sometimes it is more challenging! Making these connections is one of the tasks of the homilist, so pray for those who preach the word. The Church has paired the readings together to show us some aspect of Jesus visible in the Old Testament. Often this is a miracle or parable, but sometimes it is an identity like priest, prophet, king, redeemer, or beloved son.

Read today's first reading and Gospel again with family or friends and ask: how do the prophet Malachi (3:1-4) and the Evangelist Luke (2:22-40) describe the Lord's coming to the Temple? How is the Christ-child both a purifying fire and a light to the nations? God was present in the Temple, but where is he present in the Church today: The word? The Sacrament of the altar? The tabernacle? The heart of each person?

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

Since the 1970s, the last week in January has been known as Catholic Schools Week, a time to celebrate and promote the value of a Catholic education. January 31 is the feast day of St. John Bosco whose life work had young people and education as its focus.

John was born in early 19th century Italy. His father died when he was two, leaving his mother to raise John and his older brothers. They were poor but often helped others who were in need. His mother was a faithful and devout Catholic and raised her sons to follow that same path.

His childhood was lived in the midst of a poor community and it was difficult. One bright spot was learning magic tricks by observing some circus performers that were passing through. He used magic at an early age to get people's attention and then ask them to join him in prayer.

John's desire to become a priest came when he was quite young. The road was not easy, but he was able to eventually achieve his goal. Once a priest, he ministered to poor boys where he was assigned, including those in prison and those working. Having come from poverty himself, he understood their needs and challenges.

Most importantly, he was able to help. For

those on the street, he tried to turn their attention away from the bad things that could lead to imprisonment and toward religion and education. For the homeless, he tried to find a place for them. For those working as apprentices, he worked to relieve injustices in their working conditions.

To further his mission, he founded the Society of St. Francis de Sales and later an order of sisters to work with girls.

St. John Bosco had a two-pronged approach: faith development and education. We have that in our Catholic Schools today. Let's preserve it and help it


