Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.


Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Last week I covered the first Synod 16 Proposition and our parish goals regarding the family and ongoing human and spiritual formation for all stages of life. This week, the next Synod Proposition is focused on a parish leadership team around the pastor and subsequently to all parish and school staff.

The concept of a leadership team around the pastor was first presented to the Archdiocese in April of 2016, 7 months prior to Synod 16, at the Amazing Parish Conference. "Amazing Parish" is an organization, founded by two devoted and passionate Catholic businessmen focused on business and organizational health, who have helped more than 1,000 parishes across the country by showing them the importance of mission focused healthy organization. This conference in Detroit, was the flint and kindling that would produce the spark for Synod 16. The concept of a team around the leader was one of the great fruits that has started to change the dynamics in parishes across the Archdiocese. The team is a small group of people who share common goals as well as the rewards and responsibilities for achieving them, putting aside personal needs for the greater good of the community. The team can be staff members, especially in a large parish, or parishioners or a combination of both. Ideally, they should be people who can quickly gather around the leader to discuss issues of great importance for a healthy organization. Overall, we have seen great success in parishes over the past 4 years with the leadership team concept in parishes. As the synod proposition says, it should be subsequently be implemented for other parish and school staff.

Our first goal in terms of parish leadership teams in our parish is to annually evaluate and assess the fruitfulness of all programs, processes and people. Is one's gifts being best utilized? Are we running programs or activities that are not supported by the parishioners? Our second goal is to maintain a leadership team around the



pastor, as we have since 2016, with shared responsibilities and accountability. Our third goal is to maintain a focus on the vision of the Archbishop and the parish mission. We will do this by quarterly reviewing the principles and actions steps of the pastoral letter and subsequently our parish strategic plan. Our fourth goal is to increase awareness and involvement of staff and parishioners in our strategic plan through our annual recruitment and training.

** Today, Feb. 9, is World Marriage day as part of National Marriage Week (Feb. 7-14). Dietrich Bonhoeffer (German pastor and theologian who died in 1945) wrote to a young couple, "It's not love that keeps your marriage alive. It's marriage that keeps your love alive." (Something to think about!) There are some wonderful resources and information at:

The strengthening of marriage, and a greater understanding of "the domestic church" in our homes is also a focal point in Unleash the Gospel. Keeping with the promotion of marriage, Saturday, Feb. 15, our parish will honor those married couples celebrating "significant" anniversaries. They are great testimony to the enduring nature and significance of marriage.

Sunday of the Word of God

We'll conclude our look at how the Church uses the Scriptures at Mass.

The Responsorial Psalm: The psalm is meant to be our response to the Word proclaimed. The Psalms are the prayer book of the Bible containing God's words that we can make our own in every human circumstance: in joy, sorrow, love, grief, comfort, pain, security, or rest. When we pray the psalms we pray the same words Jesus used to pray to the Father. We praise God in the psalms and hear Jesus' voice echo in ours and ours in his (St. Augustine).

The Second Reading: As the First Readings and Gospels show us some aspect of Jesus revealed, the letters of the New Testament show us different aspects of how Jesus works in the Church. The life of the Church in New Testament times was far from simple; Paul, Peter, James, John, and many others had their work cut out for them! We read in Paul's letters of the many different matters of faith (like the mystery of the crucifixion in today's reading from 1 Corinthians 2) the early Church was trying to comprehend under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Hearing the letters should increase faith, hope, and love, and the fruits of the Spirit, in our Church today.

This is the Church's plan for reading the Scriptures every Sunday. You'll hear a good amount of the Bible at Mass, but not all of it. It is up to every Catholic, every family and parish, to continually set aside time to hear and read the Scriptures, but most importantly to pray with them. *God is speaking to you.* His voice is not so unrecognizable, nor his message so far off. "For this command which I am giving you today is not too wondrous or remote for you... No, it is something very near to you, in your mouth and in your heart, to do it" (Deuteronomy 30:11, 14).

go and make disciples

In five days, we will celebrate Valentine's Day. This is the day set aside in our modern culture to show and express our love to special someones. Love is the subject of sermons, articles, books, songs, seminars, workshops and conversations. Love in its purest divine form is far beyond our comprehension.

Today's first reading from Isaiah tells us how to love others. The examples given are works of mercy. Performing the works of mercy is a way to bring Jesus Christ to all. Performing works of mercy is simply all about love—reaching out to others with love.

So how do we make the works of mercy part of our concrete expression of faith? There is no cookie-cutter approach. For our compassion and love toward others to be effective it needs to be genuine and sincere. That means we need to decide what fits our personalities, our interests and our expertise. It may mean we need to take a giant step out of our comfort zone.

Showing mercy and love to those that we care about can be challenging at times but not really that difficult. But that Jesus "as-I-have-loved-you" kind of love and mercy is where we often get stuck. Because, come on, love my enemies? Love those who have hurt me, ignored me? Love those who aren't

Catholic, Christian? Reach out when someone we barely know is hurting?

Think about this. The first three commandments are about our relationship with God and the rest are about our relationship with others. Interesting.

Lent is right around the corner. This Lent we can try to place special emphasis on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. How we do this involves prayer and the desire to let God lead us to do His will. That's the first step—put our own spiritual life in order.

Then focus on one or two works of mercy that we feel will be an extension of our faith life. It doesn't need to be grandiose, just try and make it a consistent practice not just a one-time-only deed.

By integrating the "as-I-have-loved-you" kind of love in our actions we'll move closer to the kind of love Christ wants us to experience.

"Live in love, as Christ loved us." Ephesians 5:2

It can change us and the world!


