ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Believe it or not Lent is just about here. Last year Ash Wednesday was pretty normal even as we were hearing about a dangerous virus starting to sweep across the world. Ash Wednesday 2021 will be a slight bit different in terms of what we are used to.

Given the pandemic, the manner in which ashes will be distributed this Wednesday will not be in same as in previous

years. As you know, here in the United States, the general practice is for people to receive ashes pressed into their forehead in the form of a cross. Across Europe and many other parts of the world, people receive ashes on the top of their head. (You have seen this practice every year when they show the Pope and cardinals on Ash Wednesday.) This is the way we will receive ashes this Wednesday, with a pinch of ashes placed on the top of your head. It certainly follows what is proclaimed in the readings for Ash Wednesday, i.e., wash your face and do not let people know you are fasting. [For all these years I thought it was odd that I proclaimed that scripture passage at Mass and then make this huge black mark on someone's forehead for everyone to see they came to church that day!.]

Here are a few reminders about this Wednesday. Ashes will be distributed **after the homily**, not at the end of the Mass or service. So if you arrive 8 minutes after the start of Mass or service, you will most likely miss the opportunity to receive ashes. I will say only once, to the whole assembly of the Mass or service, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return," not to each person as they come forward. These safety protocols shall make people more comfortable at the liturgies.

Beginning Wednesday, there will be slight change at the end of some of the prayers, especially the opening prayer, during Mass. This change has been Vatican directed and approved by the United States bishops, correcting a translation from the Latin to the English. Presently a prayer may end with, "...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever," However, in the Latin, there is no mention of "one." Other countries around the world have not had "one" in their translation. So beginning Wednesday, prayers that had ended with that phrase will now end with, "...in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." Slight change but correctly translated.

One more announcement that you probably will have heard by the time this is published and read by you! Archbishop Vigneron has extended the dispensation to participate in the Sunday obligation of Mass which will now end on March 13. (The dispensation was previously to expire Feb. 15, 2021.) Seeing the gradual diminishment of the severity of the pandemic with the slow "reopening" of aspects of society, the general dispensation is being lifted. It is very important to know that while the general dispensation is lifted, encouraging people to return to the Mass and sacraments, particular dispensations are granted to those in need. Who does that entail? A person has a personal dispensation if: you are ill or your health would be compromised if contracted with a communicable illness; you exhibit flu-like symptoms; you think you are asymptomatic of a contagious illness; you care for the sick or homebound; you are pregnancy; you are 65 or older (as a high-risk individual); you cannot attend through no fault of you own (e.g., ride did not show up. Mass was a capacity, reasons out of your control, etc.); or you have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by being at Mass. So as you can see though the general dispensation has been lifted, many will probably fall into the personal dispensation given the above conditions. However, a personal

Half and Half continued dispensation does not negate the obligation for the person to observe the Lord's Day through prayer, watching Mass, other spiritual reading, etc. More about this in the weeks ahead.

** While we unfortunately will not have our Fish Fry this lent, we strongly encourage you to support our wonderful local restaurants to get your fish or meatless meals on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

Thank you for your support and continual prayers for the parish and each other. Make this Lent a good one. As you see in this bulletin, there are many opportunities to do exactly that.

Star Stewardship Update

Thanks to all the parishioners who have continue to support the programs and ministries of the parish, especially during this pandemic which has been a challenge for all of us. Through the grace of God, we are blessed in many aspects because of the thoughtfulness and generosity of many parishioners.

The Catholic Services Appeal, taking place this past autumn versus it's normal springtime initiative, has achieved its goal of pledged and received gifts specific to the CSA. The Catch a Lucky Star Raffle was very successful and \$28,000 over budget. The 2020 Christmas Collection was \$11,000 over budget. Thank you for generosity in these two collections and the raffle.

The **Sunday Offering** is our main source of income for the parish to operate. From the start of our fiscal year, July 1, 2020, through January 17, 2021, our Sunday Offering collections are \$190,000 <u>below</u> budget. This is mainly due to the fact that many catholics give to the Sunday Offering only when they attend Mass rather than providing faithful stewardship. So if people don't come to church, the parish receives no income in support of its ongoing programs and ministries..


