All I Want. That is the "theme" for **Awaken** which is coming to Star of the Sea this Friday evening at 7:30 pm. We hosted Awaken a few years ago and now we are so happy to once again host the Spring sessions for this amazing ministry.

What is Awaken about? I can't express it any better than what they have on their website (www.awakenministry.org), Our hope through this ministry is simply to bring people into an experiential encounter with Jesus Christ, such that they would be so touched by God's real presence, they would be compelled to go out and share the Good News with others!

The basic format of an Awaken experience is three-fold: praise and worship, the preached Gospel, and Eucharistic Adoration. Each Awaken event begins with upbeat praise and worship music lead by our band and worship leaders, Jeff Pipas and Andy Gardner, followed by dynamic preaching of the Gospel message, and culminating with a profound experience of Adoration, which is Eucharistic accompanied by more praise and worship music and a time of silent adoration. Key elements such as special lighting and sound, video screens displaying worship imagery and song lyrics, a creatively enhanced environment along with contemporary praise and worship music, are all meant to foster and enhance the worship experience.


Preaching Friday evening at Awaken will be Fr. Jason Brooks. A native of Milwaukee, Father Jason spent part of his college days on the gridiron where he played NCAA Division III football for the Ripon College Red Hawks and hosted a weekly classic rock radio show. He was planning to become a teacher, but after his junior year, felt a call to the priesthood and entered the Legionaries of Christ seminary. He was ordained a priest in 2004. He's a fan of fast cars, a former DJ, blues singer, and spiritual



leader to more than 700 young people as chaplain on campus at Holy Spirit Preparatory School in GA, where he also was an assistant football coach! Fr. Jason is now serving with the Legionaries in Bloomfield Hills.

Who has been attending these monthly Awaken nights? People of all ages!! I am very impressed by all the young people (25 years old and younger) who come and participate but people of every age come to experience and encounter the Lord at Awaken. Why not you?? Yes, I know it is Friday night but you don't get this opportunity in your neighborhood very often! Besides...it is Lent! Not that Awaken itself is a sacrifice, but sacrifice for the Glory!! Hope to see you Friday night.

** This Thursday night, in preparation for Awaken on Friday, Fr. Brian Meldrum and Fr. Mario Amore will be here for a presentation about the Eucharist. This is a perfect lead in to what will happen the next night on Friday. Their presentation will certainly not be boring... but will include some singing, reflecting, worship, and reflection about this treasured gift of the Eucharist, that which we celebrate in the Mass and adore after.

"Does God speak to you?"

Does God speak to you?

Some would answer with "yes", or "no", or "I'm not sure". Others would say that God speaks to us in Sacred Scripture or His Word.

This question is really meant to be about whether God speaks to you personally.

As we delve into this question, it is important to recognize that this is not about some extraordinary event, such as what St. Paul or some of the prophets experienced.

One way that God speaks to us is through His Word or Sacred Scripture. Through scripture we learn a lot about our God. The more we read, the more we learn about Him - His love for us, His mercy, why He created us, His laws or commandments, His plan for us, His Son who was sent to teach us how to live and who is our salvation.

More than being simply a source of information, His Word becomes an avenue of God speaking to us personally. This happens if we take the time to reflect on what it means for us personally, how it can and should affect our life.

Some writers point out that God has a number of other ways He uses to communicate with us. These are ways that we find meaningful --- that we can understand with our human nature.

In addition to prayer, homilies, devotions, and spiritual reading, consider things like events, people, and nature, for example.






