If you have not yet checked out Formed, a terrific resource available to you totally free at your convenience any time of the day, it is never too late to do so! All you have to do is go to www.olsos.formed.org, create your "account" and that is it! The site is filled with movies, podcasts, documentaries, bible studies, and much more, for youth and adults. If you have some questions about the Church's teachings, you can find helpful explanations. It really is a great resource!

I have mentioned to please watch a short video series on Formed, "A Lent to Remember: A Lenten Encounter with Mercy," about the Sacrament of Reconciliation or confession. There are four videos with the first three about 30. minutes long each and the last one about 12 minutes. These videos highlight the importance of the sacrament of reconciliation for our spiritual and overall well being. I know that many adults have some difficulty with the idea of confessing our sins. It is always difficult for us, flawed humans, to admit that we are not perfect, that we have done wrong, that we have not followed God's commandments. But we also know how good it is for us when we don't have baggage that weighs us down!

Tuesday night at 7 pm I will be in The Pointe for those who have watched the videos and who might still have some other questions about the sacrament. I am hoping that the videos and perhaps a little sharing about the sacrament can ease the difficulty of adults to go to confession. The sacrament of reconciliation is another one of the



great gifts given to us by Christ through the Church.

\*\* Please join us Monday night at 7:30 pm when we have another "holy hour" of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction. Our Lenten journey is only made more difficult when Jesus is not with us. Spending some quiet time with Him is the strength and remedy we need.



## go and make disciples

Prayer was mentioned in last week's article as one of the ways God speaks to us. So, this week, we will take a look at prayer with that in mind.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines prayer as a "vital and personal relationship with the living God" (2558).

Pope Francis has spoken about prayer, beginning with a simple statement that includes it being "a dialogue, a personal relationship with God".

He warns that it is "not the prayer of words, like a parrot; but the prayer of the heart: gazing on the Lord, hearing the Lord, asking the Lord". In other words, it's not simply a recitation, but often in our own words.

You may have heard of a helpful way of remembering the components of prayer by using ACTS. It stands for Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving, and Supplication.

Pope Francis and many others say that "listening" is also a component of prayer. "Praying, as every true dialogue, also knows how to be in silence — in dialogues there are moments of silence — in silence together with Jesus."

Praying from the heart is part of what Pope Francis has preached. It is also emphasized here by St. Padre Pio: "You must speak to Jesus not only with your lips, but with your heart. In fact on certain occasions you should only speak to Him with your heart."

Taking this discussion beyond personal prayer, Pope Francis reminds us of the

importance of our Eucharistic celebration. "Mass is prayer; rather, it is prayer par excellence, the loftiest, the most sublime, and at the same time the most "concrete". In fact it is the loving encounter with God

through his Word and the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is an encounter with the Lord."

In summary, our prayer should come from our hearts and include adoration, contrition, thanksgiving, supplication, and listening. Our prayer reflects our personal relationship with God.

These words were used in defining or preaching about prayer: relationship, hearing, silence, dialogue. All point to God speaking to us at some time, in some way. Keep open to the possibilities.




