
Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.



Our Lenten theme for our School children this year is based upon the prayer of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis is known for his preaching about returning to God and obedience to the




Church as well as his great love for all of God's wonderful creation. He is the patron saint of Animals and Ecology.

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

It is not how much we do,

the sick

go and make disciples

Presented here last week was the basic call to holiness for all of us that Pope Francis addressed in a recent apostolic exhortation. (Rejoice and Be Glad: The Call to Holiness in Today's World, 2018)

His emphasis is that the call is for everyone, each in their own way, and it can be done in today's world with all our roles and responsibilities. Even doing small things can help us grow in holiness, the Pontiff says.

In giving us some guidelines to follow, he looks to Jesus, "the Master", and His

Word in Sacred Scripture. Specifically, he uses the Beatitudes and points out that "holy" can be substituted for "blessed" or "happy" once you delve into each one.

He challenges us to think about each Beatitude in new ways. He proceeds to help us do just that, calling that section "Going Against the Flow" since it truly is countercultural. Here is a summary of the key ideas.

The "poor in spirit": being pure in heart; not having our focus on material things; serving others.

The meek: having humility; trusting in the Lord.

Those who mourn: having empathy; helping the suffering; being there for them.

Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness: helping the weak, the poor, the vulnerable.

The merciful: giving of self to others; also forgiving others.

The pure in heart: having the right motivation or intent in what we do.

The peacemakers:

seeking peace and harmony in any situation.

Those persecuted for righteousness sake: living out the Gospel even with subtle or direct activity by others.

These really encompass what Pope Francis has called "living our lives with love".

Mother Teresa has a great quote that applies to serving others: "It is not how much we do, but how much love we put in the action that we do."
