ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

What unprecedented times we are in! I know many people are quite unsettled by what is happening regarding the Coronavirus (Covid-19). We have been watching this virus sweep across the world and now it is in our country and own backyard. It has frightened many people to the point where they are hoarding important items for basic living, e.g., masks, gloves, alcohol wipes, sanitizer, etc., that are necessary for those health care professionals to help take care of the sick. It has been amazing to see so many of the store shelves that once had toilet paper, cleaners, eggs, meat - all empty!

Unfortunately, while many have been stockpiling, I worry about those who truly need items now and can't find any, like the elderly. If only everyone would be considerate of others, and not take everything for themselves, everyone would be less stressed! We need to look after and care for others through kindness and sharing. We, likewise, need to pray for each other.

The difficulty of this situation is the fluidity and how fast things change. One day we can be limited to 100 people gathering, then the next day 50, then ten, and who knows if it may go down to two! Making the decisions for such a large group of people is difficult. You have to think about the facts of this hour and this day.

There is no sense telling you in this article what we are doing here at the parish because I am sure by the time you read this thing may have changed! I can only tell you that we will make decisions to help the common good and the community, to stop the spread of this virus and not put others in harm's way. I believe the inconvenience will be worth it if we can create a healthy and stabilized environment for all.

As it appears now, our parish Holy Week services will be closed to the public, even Easter Mass. I know these services will most likely be live-streamed from the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament. Do not lose hope! We know our Lord is with us and Our Lady is watching out for us. This is a perfect time to engage in more prayer to Our Lady Star of the Sea as she guides us through the stormy water into safe harbor. See the additional prayers to Our Lady of Lourdes and the prayers Archbishop Vigneron has requested that we pray, a spiritual communion, in the absence of not being able to receive Holy Communion, and the Memorare as we petition Our Blessed Mother. I pray for you as I, and Fr. Brian, continue to celebrate the requested Masses privately. Continue praying and we will be amazed by the blessings on this community!

** During the COVID-19 pandemic and the temporary suspension of public Masses in the Archdiocese of Detroit, Our Lady Star of the Sea still needs your support. Although we are not celebrating Mass as a parish community, we still have a need to pay our staff, maintain the church building, and continue our outreach ministries. It is true that I only get to see a fraction of you because of my responsibilities at St. Aloysius, but the kindness and generosity of the entire parish is evident most especially through your support of the ministries that I oversee through St. Aloysius Neighborhood Services and St. Dominic Outreach Center. The school supplies, cleaning products, canned food, and donations to both organizations at Christmas is a true testament of your dedication to the works of mercy.

The Lenten season provides us with another opportunity for almsgiving. This year, your Christian Service Commission has graciously chosen St. Aloysius Parish as one of the ministries to support. Gianna House: Gianna House is a Pregnancy and Parenting Residence and Center whose mission is to provide a safe residence for pregnant teens and their newborn infants and while providing spiritual, educational, and parenting support and resources to underserved women in our program. Teens may come to reside with us anytime during their pregnancy and remain up to 1 year after giving birth, if they so desire, during which time they continue their high school education and gain parenting and life skills.

Our Community Outreach Program serves mothers of any age by offering parenting, personal growth, spiritual journey, life skills, and enrichment classes. By attending classes, mothers earn "Baby Bucks" to obtain needed items from our baby shop, as well as gain social support from one another. Here is how one mother explains why she participates in our program. "My name is Monique and I have a beautiful, happy, daughter, Serenity, who is 15 months old. I have been attending Gianna House since the beginning of my pregnancy. The reason I continue to come to Gianna House after having my child is because they are a support group and family. The classes they offer here are the classes I need to be a better me and to be as good a mom that I can be. I also meet some other mothers here I can relate to or whom I can share my story with — someone who is now going through what I went through during my pregnancy and after my pregnancy. Before I came to Gianna House, I didn't have anyone to vent to, and the ones I did vent to judged me. But here we don't judge each other no matter what. We try to build one another up. I can honestly say I am happy that Gianna House came into my life when it did, and I'm happy that I met the wonderful moms who come here as well. Want to spend time in a desert? Can you be without your phone or other electronic device for a while? Pope Francis suggests we do both during Lent.

We can understand the benefit of spending less time using our electronic devices. But why would we want to spend time in a desert? Well, think of it more as withdrawing to a place with fewer distractions, a quieter place.

He said "It is a place of silence, where we are interiorly free to hear the Lord's word and to experience his loving call. In our busy world, how much we need that kind of silence, in order to grow in prayerful openness to God, to cultivate ecology of the heart and to center our lives on the things that really matter."

In previous articles, we've talked about various ways to encounter Jesus, such as in prayer, scripture, and works of mercy. This is what Pope Francis had to say about the importance of each of type of encounter as we observe Lent 2020.

"Even more than a duty, prayer is an expression of our need to respond to God's love which always precedes and sustains us....Prayer can take any number of different forms, but what truly matters in God's eyes is that it penetrates deep within us and chips away at our hardness of heart, in order to convert us ever more fully to God and to his will."

Regarding scripture, he said "The more fully we are engaged with his word, the more we will experience the mercy he freely gives us."

He had this to say about works of mercy. We need to share what we have "with those most in need, as a means of personally participating in the building of a better world."

Let's try to find our own "desert" and focus on the "things that really matter".
