That was the general theme as Pope Francis was urging the faithful who gathered at St. Peter's in the Vatican for a penitential service a few years ago.


"When our desire to be healed becomes more courageous, it leads to prayer, to crying out fervently and persistently for help, as did Bartimeus: 'Jesus, Son of God, have mercy on me." Like Bartimeus, who has blind, Catholics go to confession because they want to see again. "Our sins have made us lose sight of all that is good and have robbed us of the beauty of our calling, leading us instead far away from our journey's end." said Pope Francis.

It is easy for us to think we are not blinded, but we are. We are blind to our sin which "impoverishes and isolates us." This blindness only prevents us from seeing what is most important and instead makes us focus on ourselves "until we are indifferent to others and to what is good."

"How easy and misguided it is to believe that life depends on what we have, on our success and on the approval we receive," the pope said. Sin makes the people believe "the economy is only for profit and consumption" and "that personal desires are more important than social responsibility."

Lent is the favorable and acceptable time to come into the Lord's presence and to return to the Lord with all our heart.

This is the time to think about experiencing the Lord's great mercy given to us through the Sacrament of Penance. This is the place for us to go and lay everything on the Lord, leave the baggage behind, and walk away knowing God's unconditional love and mercy for us, his beloved children!



Another form of fasting has nothing to do with food. You may have heard that Pope Francis challenged Catholics to fast from gossip this Lent.


Pope Francis said in a homily on Sunday, March 3, that Catholics should reflect on the "temptation of gossip" as Lent begins. One thing Catholics should ask themselves, said Pope Francis, is "If, by the end of Lent, we are able to correct this a bit and not go around always criticizing others behind their backs, I assure you (the celebration of) Jesus' resurrection will be more beautiful." He also said Jesus "wants to teach us to not go around criticizing others, not go looking for others' defects, but look first at your own." That is some real food for thought!

Self-discipline is a virtue we could all seek to attain during this season of Lent whether it relates to food, gossip, or other vices/distractions that we want to rid ourselves of. Many blessings on your continued Lenten journey!

Scripture speaks often of the three pillars that are essential to living out the faith of our fathers and of Jesus Christ: prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Prayer and almsgiving seem to be ways that we can combine our spiritual lives with our practical lives. Prayer can flow into performing the works of mercy, and almsgiving can come from that.

How about that third pillar, fasting? I've read that Lent is sometimes called the "Great Fast." It's a period of time in which Christians are meant to give up some

comfort or adopt some spiritual practice that leads to self-examination, repentance, and, ultimately, renewal of the soul.

The "Great Fast"

In both the Old and New Testaments, it seems that fasting was standard operating procedure. Jesus didn't say "if you fast," He said, "when you fast."

In our day and age fasting seems to have become a lost discipline among ordinary faithful Catholics.

Oh, I fast and abstain on the designated days and throughout Lent but I don't think I'm always getting the real purpose of fasting. Throughout my lifetime most Catholics' concerns around fasting were: Does the day of fasting begin and end at midnight? How about Sundays? How do I

I've read and been taught that fasting enables praver and prayer enables action.

Not eating or giving something up can force us to focus our thoughts and help us not take our blessings of food, money and shelter for granted. Fasting can help us reflect more on what we can do to be intentional disciples of Jesus.

Maybe this Lent I can learn how to better adapt the discipline of fasting to my daily life

May our Lenten fasting stretch us spiritually and raise our "giving up" to a sacred level.


