#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

#### MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

#### PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Let us show our appreciation to them but also pray for them as well. We are thankful for their courage and



sacrifices to help us try and continue to bring about a sense of "normal" in a fragile world and community.

## FORMING OUR FAITH



Come Holy Spirit!

During these 50 days of the Easter season, we read from the Acts of the Apostles the many stories of the apostles stepping out in faith after having received the gift of the Holy Spirit. And, boy, did they step out! From being a group hiding in an upper room to boldly proclaiming Christ Jesus and converting 3000 people in one day! What was it that came over them and how do I get some of that?!

Well, we receive these gifts in Baptism and, as our Confirmation candidates have learned over the past 2years, these gifts are **confirmed** in the Sacrament of Confirmation. It is the *Gifts of the Holy Spirit* that gave the apostles the strength and conviction of faith to go out and give witness to Jesus Christ—just as we are to do in this day and age.

So here's a quick reminder of what those Gifts are:

**Wisdom** is the gift of knowing the right choices to make in order to live a holy life. The gift of wisdom helps you to avoid the things that could lead you away from God.

**Understanding** is the gift of comprehension, or the ability to grasp the meaning, of the teachings of the Church. The gift of understanding helps you be tolerant and sympathetic of others. It helps you sense when someone is hurting or in need of compassion.

**Right Judgment, or Counsel,** is the gift of prudence. The gift of right judgment helps you make choices to live as a faithful follower of Jesus.

**Courage, or Fortitude,** is the gift that helps you stand up for your faith in Christ. The gift of courage helps you overcome any obstacles that would keep you from practicing your faith.

**Knowledge** is the gift of knowing and enlightenment. The gift of knowledge enables you to choose the right path that will lead you to God. It encourages you to avoid obstacles that will keep you from him.

**Reverence, or Piety,** is the gift of confidence in God. This gift of reverence inspires you to joyfully want to serve God and others.

Wonder and Awe, or Fear of the Lord, is the gift of amazement and respect that encourages you to be in awe of God. The gift of wonder and awe moves you to so love God that you do not want to offend him by your words or actions.

Take time during this Easter season to read the Acts of the Apostles on your own and see if you can spot examples of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit in the actions of the apostles. Choose one gift that you feel you are most in need right now and ask for an increase in that Gift. God is always waiting to hear from you!


