ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Today, the Third Sunday of Easter, we recall in the Gospel (Lk 24:13-25) the well-known "Road to Emmaus." It is always a good story to read and specially to put ourselves in the story! We do what the apostles have done, have we not. We get together with family or friends and we begin to recall what has happened.

Something might have happened a few hours, days or even years ago and we begin to reminisce, we recall what we went through, almost like we relive the event itself. Maybe someone chimes in something about the story or event we did not know. More sharing begins to happen. We then find even greater awareness of what really happened. Maybe we even discover something more about ourself.

I imagine people have been finding out a bit more about each other as they spend more time with each other. More stories are being told. People might be reflecting more about their past, about family gathering years ago. This is all good stuff!! I hear many families are getting together through the marvels of technology where they can see and hear all 12 or 20 or 40 people in their family or group of friends. They are learning so much more about each other. On Easter Sunday afternoon one of my cousins got about 20 of us cousins together for a "Zoom" meeting through our computers or phones. It was terrific to see those in Ohio and Florida and



Illinois and around Michigan and it not being a funeral! We laughed and joked and caught up with one another. We prayed and renewed our hope in the goodness of the Lord.

I urge you this weekend to follow the example of the Apostles and get together and have your own Road to Emmaus. Tell some stories. Recall the past and find the Lord in both the good time and the less good times. Maybe even share some new revelations about yourself! Above all, reflect where the Lord has been through all these stories and once again realize that He has not left you but still guides you today! The Risen Lord walks with us today. Alleluia!


