The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). We have this great feast to increase our appreciation of this great gift of the Eucharist in our Church and in our lives.

Saint Pope John Paul II, in his encyclical "Church of the Eucharist," begins with the most simple but direct statements: "The church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the

heart of the mystery of the church."

It can be so simple for us to take for granted this great gift of the eucharist. Maybe we feel we come to Mass so often and it usually seems to be the same thing over and over and over again. However, if we really contemplate what Christ has done for us in giving us His Body and Blood for our very lives through the celebration of the Mass, we can only be drawn into "profound amazement and gratitude." As Pope John Paul II wrote in his conclusion of the encyclical: "In the humble signs of bread and wine changed into his body and blood, Christ walks beside us as our strength and our food for the journey, and he enables us to become for everyone witnesses of hope. If in the presence of this mystery, reason experiences its limits, the heart, enlightened by the grace of the Holy Spirit, clearly sees the response that is demanded and bows low in adoration and unbounded love."

The celebration of the Mass is truly awesome indeed and maybe, ultimately, too mind boggling for us! But the Church gives us the whole celebration of Mass and the Eucharist so we can encounter Christ in our daily life and then be transformed into that image and presence of Christ in the world around us. The readings and homily are meant, not to necessarily teach or catechize the faith, but to point how the Word of God we hear at Mass is being encountered by us and is alive indeed in the midst of our lives as we hear it! With hearts of gratitude for that presence and action of God in our midst, we then offer that sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, i.e., Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus then becomes food for our daily journey so we can be Christ to others in our daily life! Yes- it is mind boggling indeed!




If you wish, your family can be photographed with Father and we will email the photo to you for you to mark the occasion and retain as a keepsake.

Stewardship Thoughts

Today's Scripture readings emphasize the old and new covenants. In the Book of Exodus, Moses brings the ancient Israelites to an agreement with God through the sacrificial blood of young bulls. This action prefigures Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the Cross for our sins, and the opportunity for eternal salvation. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews contrasts Old Testament sacrifices of goats and calves with the new covenant sealed in the very Blood of Christ. In St. Mark's Gospel, the evangelist describes Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at our Lord's Last Supper. This begins the new covenant with His disciples — a covenant that continues for us today. As faithful stewards, we believe in Christ's true presence, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in Holy Communion. By receiving this tremendous gift, we become what we consume, finding strength to live virtuous and holy lives, deepening our love for God and neighbor in need. Learn when Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction are scheduled in your parish and spend some quiet time with our Lord and Savior.
