

UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

What makes a parish vibrant? Over the 10 years of writing articles for this column I have read many articles with thoughts on what are vibrant, amazing parishes and how parishes achieve that goal. I've sat through meetings on the vicariate level that center on activities and programs and more programs.

Since the Synod and the launching of Unleash the Gospel, I've thought about this a lot.

Every parish strives for active, vibrant parishes. But what kind of vibrancy are we seeking. For most, having lots of stuff to do and packed calendars is the goal in creating a vibrant parish.

That seems like a good thing and in one sense it really is. After all we have a lot to do to help bring Christ to others; we need to evangelize, we need to catechize all ages, we need to care for those in need, we need to reach outside of our parish boundaries to the marginalized, we need to run our school and sports activities, etc., etc.

But is business and having lots of programs the answer? Programs and events are good tools of evangelization. The problem that can occur is that in our desire to meet all our goals, our quick response is to offer more.

I read recently that more programs, even great programs, that seem to be an attraction are really distractions that keep us from focusing on what is most important for spiritual growth. They can, paradoxically, keep us from being what Sherry Waddell calls "intentional disciples."

It would be wonderful if all our committees, commissions, organizations, our school, etc. were

focused on forming intentional disciples not just on the tasks at hand. But that is not the reality.

We need to not only preach, teach and talk about building a personal relationship with Jesus, we need to foster that in all our activities. We need to create that relational experience in all we do.

In 2012, the USCCB's Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis wrote:

...the work of the Holy Spirit within the Christian community forms the person as a disciple of Christ. One seeking to learn how to be a disciple of Christ does so through apprenticeship.

"...the work of the Holy Spirit within the Christian community forms the person as a disciple of Christ."

Apprenticeship! Interesting.

We need a system—a focused process for all our groups to be involved in growing communities of disciples so that evangelization in the fullest

Catholic sense of the term flourishes in parishes and overflows to the world.

The point is that in unifying parish life in such a way, the process of spiritual growth becomes clear. Vibrancy flows not from the business, from the quantity of activities, but from the networks of relationships centered on solid proclamation of the Gospel and catechesis that is "caught, not taught" through an apprenticeship model.

Let's work to build a truly vibrant parish.
