

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Fuel the Mission. That is the purpose of this year's Catholic Services Appeal. It is an appropriate reminder of what we need to do each year to keep the momentum going to bring Christ to others. The "others" includes not only our neighbors or other individuals who are seeking Christ in their life. It also includes each one of us because we benefit from the more than 170 programs, ministries and services funded by the CSA. So the mission needs fuel and it is up to us to provide the fuel to keep the machinery

moving.

We see the benefits of the CSA in our schools, our campus ministries, chaplaincies in hospitals and prisons, the CYO, services to the poor and vulnerable, the formation of our seminarians (like seminarian James Bird who has been with us the past 6 weeks) and those studying for other ministries in the Church, the "Mass for Shut-Ins," support for the rights of the unborn and those who have experienced the trauma of abortion, for all the communication and media efforts to bring the Good News to people of all ages in a variety of different formats, and so much more. All that is funded by the CSA and is tremendously important to the life and breath of the Church that cannot be accomplished by a single parish or three. Nonetheless, when we all pool our resources, the mission of Jesus, to provide the material and spiritual needs of people in southeast Michigan, is achieved. (It is also good to note that all funds given to the CSA is administered and overlooked by a lay council and no funds have been, are, or will be used to settle any lawsuits of any kind.)

Some things are a bit different this year with the CSA. As you might recall, last year's CSA was delayed from its normal April-May time to September-October. To relieve the parishes, the CSA was coordinated by the Archdiocese of Detroit (and it was very successful). To further assist the parishes this year, it is again coordinated by the AoD. Letters to people that have made gifts during the past three years were sent out in late April. I have heard from some of you that you did not receive those. (They did not have the parish letterhead/envelopes but rather the CSA logo on it.) One possible scenario is they are still stuck in the US mail system someplace! I believe another letter would be forthcoming from the AoD CSA office in a month or so. To help process all gifts and pledges in a more efficient and timely manner, which has been problematic in recent years, the gifts are being sent directly to the gift processing center in Minnesota, who have been processing the CSA gifts for the past 10 years or so. (In past years, the gifts often sat in Detroit for 7 or 10 days, or more, before being sent for processing.)

Here is the bottom line. We have been successfully meeting our target the past few years because of your understanding to support the mission of the Church. The many gifts and generosity help us exceed the target with the excess returned to the parish and likewise providing funds for our own parish ministries and programs. I know we can do the same again this year! What is most important is that we share in this larger mission of the Church by giving to the CSA. For those who might have missed the earlier letter, or did not receive one, please Fuel the Mission by viewing the page in this bulletin, follow the CSA link on our parish website (www.olsos.org), or pick up a brochure in the gathering space and make your pledge or gift. You also have an opportunity to leave your prayer intention for Archbishop Vigneron who prays with them in his chapel. Thank you for your willingness to offer a gift and Fuel the Mission from your heart for the heart of Christ.

Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Scripture reading from the Prophet Ezekiel, God tends to the trees to provide protection and a dwelling place for the birds. This Old Testament passage is connected to the story of the mustard seed proclaimed in St. Mark's Gospel. Jesus describes how the smallest of seeds on earth produces a plant large enough for birds to dwell in it. At our Baptism, Jesus invites us to be His disciples. The seed is planted. If we open our hearts to this invitation, we can develop a personal relationship with Christ — He becomes the center of our lives. Discipleship increases our faith in Jesus and grows abundantly when nurtured through the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, prayer, the Word of God, and love of neighbor. In a spirit of evangelization, our joy in Jesus overflows when we share it with those we meet. 




- Once a long-time supporter of the amendment, President Biden is now committed to its repeal [4].
- The chair of the House committee in charge of funding government programs broke with long-standing, bipartisan support. She announced that the amendment will NOT be included in the upcoming funding bill [5]. House Speaker Nancy Pelosi voiced support for this decision [6].

BILLIONS in Abortion Funding WITHOUT THE HYDE AMENDMENT

- Without the Hyde Amendment and related policies, billions of taxpayer dollars could be used to pay for abortions in the U.S. and overseas.
- Getting rid of the amendment would likely lead to many more lives lost through abortion [7]. States' health benefits would likely be held hostage. States would be forced to either include elective abortion in Medicaid or be kicked out of the federal Medicaid program.


