** Back on Sunday night May 20 we had a significant power surge in the school. There was a failure of two original cables that connect the main power panels in the school library to the distribution panels in the boiler



UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

Most of what is written in this Evangelization column is about our relationships with God and those with whom we come in contact.

Every so often, we address our interaction with society. This is another dimension of Evangelization that encompasses both individuals and the Church.

Recognizing that living the Gospel drives us to reach out and have an impact, the US Bishops made this one of three Evangelization goals:

"To foster gospel values in our society, promoting the dignity of the human person, the importance of the family, and the common good of our society, so that our nation may continue to be transformed by the saving power of Jesus Christ."

Promoting and defending the common good is an objective of federal, state and local governments and of faith-based organizations.

The organization of US Bishops (www.usccb.org) monitors developments in several areas, including respect for human life and marriage, religious liberty, and justice.

The Michigan Catholic Council (www.micatholic.org) performs a similar, but more focused role at the state level. Both websites contain issues and updates, including what individuals can do.

Many believe that because we can worship, we have religious freedom. But it goes beyond that.

Religious liberty is a fundamental right. Governments cannot force us into acting against our consciences.

Faith-based organizations have encountered issues impacting their ability to continue serving the community in accordance with their mission.

In response, Kansas and Oklahoma both enacted laws in May effectively continuing to allow faith-based adoption and foster care providers to perform those services in a manner consistent with their religious beliefs.

They are now in a group of at least nine states, including Michigan, with similar legislation.

"Religious liberty is a fundamental right."

In a different direction, this March the City of Philadelphia stopped placing children with foster care families through Catholic Social Services and another faith-based provider. This is despite a shortage of foster parents in the city.

There is hope that the ban will be reversed. A lawsuit has been filed on behalf of current foster parents.

"People of faith are committed to serving others in God's love in healthcare, child welfare, migration and refugee resettlement, education, and more. Religious freedom protects the space in which we can continue to serve...Join Catholics across the country to pray and act for the freedom to serve faithfully and with integrity. (USCCB)"
