ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

I want to keep you informed about the procedures and policies in the Archdiocese of Detroit regarding any clergy sexual abuse allegations and subsequent actions.

The AoD now has a dedicated sub webpage regarding the protection of our children and youth. You can find it near the bottom of the AoD.org website or at "protect.aod.org." There you will find resources, policies, procedures, how to report an abuse, what the AoD has done to assist the victims, and so much more.

In many ways the AoD has been ahead of other dioceses in this very unfortunate situation. We were one of the first dioceses to have a review board going back to 1988. It was reconstituted in early 2002. Our review board consists of a retired prosecutor, a psychologist, a health care executive, a former superintendent of Catholic schools, and an archdiocesan pastor. Since 2002 the AoD entered into a voluntary agreement with its 6 county prosecutors to open and share its files of priests accused of sexual misconduct. With that, 4 criminal prosecutions resulted. Since 2002, every complaint is reported to civil authorities without pre-screening.

Complaints are considered by the Review Board, including an independent investigation. If the complaint is credible, i.e., it has a "semblance of truth," it is sent to the archbishop who forwards the case to the Vatican Congregation for the Doctrine of the



Faith. If it is a credible complaint, no priest or deacon is allowed to continue in active ministry during the time of review. If the allegation is proven to be true, the cleric's name is posted on the AoD website and the media is also notified. This public posting has been done for more than 15 years. Parishes where the cleric served are also notified.

Since 2002 and the publication of the US Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, the AoD has implemented a number of safe environment programs to help identify situations that might leave a children in a vulnerable state with sexual offenders. These programs highlight what to see if a child is abused. It is also most valuable for those who are with children and the most vulnerable to prevent themselves being in positions to be accused of any allegations. So it is protecting the youth and the adults who are with the youth. The AoD

Each year, more than 29,000 students in the AoD K-12 schools and more than 39,000 students in religious education programs receive training. In reality, any volunteer or employee who can be in an unsupervised position with youth or vulnerable adults must participate in the 3 hour Protecting God's Children workshop and likewise pass a criminal background check,



It's good to remember that the three wise men who visited Jesus were from outside Israel. They were foreigners and strangers.

Throughout the Old testament there was a struggle about who were the recipients of God's promise. Some believed only those in the bloodline and inheritance of Israel were the chosen ones.

That was at the heart of Paul's argument with Peter, whether the Gentiles -- the foreigners, the strangers and sojourners -- were to be received into the Body of Christ, or whether that was reserved only for those of Israelite blood and lineage.

We know the outcome. Paul preached the good news to those considered to be outside the covenant, and so we -- we, the Gentiles -- are included in the Body of Christ.

The message that comes across to me is that we need to see Jesus in everyone and reach out so that all feel truly welcome.

When we say all are welcome, do we really mean all? We need to mean everyone, even those who push us outside our comfort zone.

We need to make everyone feel the love of Jesus not just at the front door of church but in meetings and gatherings, in all areas of our lives.

A friend gave me the "All are welcome card" that is available at his church in Florida. It is so inclusive and done in a humorous way. Here are few of the challenging words.

"We extend a special welcome to those who are single, married, divorced, gay, filthy rich, dirt poor."

"You're welcome here if you're "just browsing," just woke up or just got out of jail. We don't care if you're more Catholic than the Pope, or haven't been in church since little Joey's baptism."

"...to those who think the earth is flat, work too hard, don't work, can't spell, or came because grandma is in town and wanted to go to church. We welcome those who are inked, pierced or both."

There's a lot more on this card. It sends a great message. It ends this way:

"We welcome the flexible, inflexible, tolerant and intolerant, those who laughed as well as those who gasped at the welcome card. We welcome tourists, seekers, doubters, bleeding hearts and you."




