



No one has the right to another person's certificate, except: the parent/guardian of a minor child. (Archdiocese of Detroit)

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

Tomorrow, at 7:30 pm, we have our monthly “Holy Hour.” Every first Monday of the month we take the time to simply spend time with the Lord in church with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament that concludes with Benediction and a blessing with the Blessed Sacrament. There are many important areas of life that need our prayer as we contemplate the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We need to pray for our presidential candidates and those running for election. We need to pray for the end of violence in our communities and our world. We need to pray for the protection of all life. We need to pray for the continual outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church’s evangelization efforts and the proposed Family of Parishes. We need to pray to the Holy Spirit for an outpouring of Grace upon our parish and mission. And so much more! So please consider coming to this service as we offer our many prayers to the Lord.

Wednesday, October 7, is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. As you know the Rosary is an excellent prayer for an individual, a family, or a group of people. There is a great sense of unity for those who pray the Rosary. St. John Paul II said in his 2002 apostolic letter on the Rosary said: *As a prayer for peace, the Rosary is also, and always has been, a prayer of and for the family. At one time this prayer was particularly dear to Christian families, and it certainly brought them closer together. It is important not to lose this precious inheritance. We need to return to the practice of family prayer and prayer for families, continuing to use the Rosary... The family that prays together stays together. The Holy Rosary, by age-old tradition, has shown itself particularly effective as a prayer which brings the family together. Individual family members, in turning their eyes towards Jesus, also regain the ability to look one another in the eye, to communicate, to show solidarity, to forgive one another and to see their covenant of love renewed in the Spirit of God. (ROSARIUM VIRGINIS MARIAE)*

Weather permitting, we will pray the rosary at the Rosary Garden Wednesday night at 7:30 pm.





Bible Study is returning in Fall 2020!

- Who Jesus is and how he answers the longings of the human heart.
- Why Jesus was baptized.
- The significance of the Transfiguration.
- The essentials of Christology explained in a way the average Catholic can understand.
- The mystery and meaning of the Resurrection, Christ’s triumph over death.
- The nature of Jesus’ mission and the redemption of humanity.


