

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

What comprises a parish? What is essential for a parish community and what then flows from it? Certainly what is essential is the weekly, and even daily, celebration of the Eucharist. During the celebration of the Eucharist we gather as the Body of Christ to offer Him back to God the Father, the perfect sacrifice for all God has done for his people, and what he continues to do today, and in the

future. That is essential, from the Last Supper until today. As the Mass is the source and summit of all that we do, everything flows into the celebration of Mass and everything flows from our celebration. We are called and challenged to serve one another through acts of charity. We are called to educate and form ourselves, and others, in the ways and practices of the faith. We are called to come together as a community to know each other, supporting and consoling each other within our shared life. A parish is certainly more than simply "having Mass" and dispensing the sacraments.

As you all know, the parish is to provide programs and engage others in ministries to help to build up and serve the Church. There are the various ministries that are present at our Sunday Masses, i.e., servers, lectors, ushers, music ministers, extraordinary ministers of the Holy Communion, sacristans, and caretakers of the linens. Each of those ministries play an important part in each of our celebrations. The other programs or ministries often found in a parish are also very important for a vibrant parish. Adult faith formation, faith formation for children, companions to accompany those desiring to become Catholic, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Mens' organization, grief ministers, programs or drives to help the less fortunate, hospitality, are just a few that help to round out the picture for a healthy parish, serving and loving in the name of Jesus.

Next weekend, in the Gathering Space, you will have an opportunity to ask questions to program or ministry representatives, and volunteer for the program or ministry that will engage you in the faith and service to others. None are very time consuming. Some operate on a more regular basis and some are once or twice a year. What is important is the engagement you have to live out the call of discipleship through active participation with others, bringing forth blessings upon many!

Throughout the year I often get asked about one thing or another that we used to have and do not have presently, It all comes down to volunteers that make it happen, The great parish staff can only do so much! Volunteers truly make a parish great

MASS INTENTIONS What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

It is worth noting, however, that the offering of the Mass for that intention does not depend on it being publicly voiced but on it being specified in the priest's personal prayers. Similarly, if a priest announces that "I am offering this Mass for [such and such an] intention" he does not thereby require the rest of the congregation to pray for that intention.

In the framework of the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews: ... for whom and through whom all things exist through God, today's Scripture readings from the Book of Genesis and St. Mark's Gospel promote the common theme of sacred marriage. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. It is clear from these Scripture readings that God's blessing of marriage is the union between one man and one woman. This is God's teaching on Christian marriage. It is this Scriptural Truth, this Church teaching, that faithful stewards must embrace to counter secular society's law, which professes a false image of marriage. In this Truth, the Sacrament of Matrimony accomplishes its full Christian meaning and potential by strengthening husbands and wives to love and serve the Lord and one another. 
Greeters

Cantors are scheduled monthly and rehearse individually with the music minister before each Mass. The cantor sings the psalm and helps lead congregational song.




