Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.


Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.





### Teacher Feature – Melissa Walter

Technology is undergoing major changes. Keeping up with technology will be easier for our children because they are growing up with the ability to reach the world quickly and easily. The teacher's role is changing, the days of the classroom teacher being the only source of information is changing to facilitating students in their own learning goals. Learning through collaboration and communication can allow our digital learners the opportunity to problem-solve, interact, and have authentic learning experiences. These experiences then lead to computational thinking, a logical approach to problem solving, that can be applied to any problem, task or system.

How is this being implemented? Students younger than kindergarten can manipulate the mouse and keyboard, or use an iPad, or a parent's phone. Students are learning coding as the ability to tell the computer what to do in a logical manner. In fact, soon the most

prevalent universal language will be that of coding. Star of the Sea has Maker's Empire where students work in collaboration to create three dimensional models based on a problem to be solved. These solutions can then 3d print their models and prototypes. And use real world applications to design and fabricate. Quoting Steve Jobs, "Everybody in this country should learn how to program a computer...because it teaches you how to think."

## *Be the Domestic Church Sharing about Jesus at Home*

### *Why use SELF-CONTROL?*

In our Faith Formation classes this year, our theme is "Journey to Holiness" and we are looking for ways to be holy everyday. One of those ways is to practice self-control. Self-control often means saying "no" to yourself, like when you want to eat too much, talk too much, watch too much TV or play video games. What unkind people in your life can you put into God's hands while you trust him to bring justice?

# UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

## go and make disciples

The term "missionary disciple" may seem new, but what it means is not at all new. It's much like what happened during the time of Christ and after His Ascension.

Ordinary people heard about Jesus and became "followers", learning about His teachings and believing in His promises. That's the "disciple" part.

That changed their lives. They felt the love of Jesus and their joy was evident. They were anxious to share that joy and the reason for it with others. This is the "missionary" part.

In the latter part of the twentieth century, there began a gradual reawakening of the missionary nature of the Church and its members.

The article two weeks ago in this column about missionary disciples had a focus on informally sharing God's love with people we encounter who are struggling in some way. These would be people we know or that would cross our path.

Another part of missionary discipleship is its social dimension. It involves people we would not necessarily know like the poor and the vulnerable. This social aspect of missionary discipleship is also driven by God's love.

"...to receive God's love and to love him in return with the very love which is his gift, brings forth in our lives and actions a primary and fundamental response: to desire, seek and protect the good of others." Pope Francis (The Joy of the Gospel)

Those we don't encounter are the object of this part of missionary discipleship. So, it calls for different action on our part.

One way is going out to where the people are, such as soup kitchens. Another is working through organized efforts, such as parish clothing and food drives. Prayer is an option for those unable to participate in those ways. Finally, there is financial contribution.

In these works of love, we encounter Christ in the people we serve.

Jesus said "...what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me. (Mt 25:45)
