

The Meaning of Advent Candles

As a Christian tradition, the wreath holds the four Advent candles. The candles represent Jesus coming as the light in darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday until all four candles are lit, and sometimes a fifth candle is lit on Christmas. As Christmas draws nearer, each candle brings a little more light into the darkness.

Each of the candles represents an aspect of preparation during the season of Advent:

The Candle of Hope Color: Purple. Purple is the primary color associated with Advent. Within the Catholic Church it symbolizes penance, preparation, and sacrifice. During the first week of Advent, we look forward to Jesus' coming with hope.

The Candle of Peace Color: Purple. During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and work on becoming better-versions-of-ourselves in preparation for Jesus' coming.

The Candle of Joy Color: Pink. This third candle is pink, symbolizing anticipation and rejoicing. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on Christmas day.

The Candle of Love Color: Purple. During this final week of Advent we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, which is made apparent in the birth of his Son:

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." - John 3:16

"With Mary, we bring people to Christ to live the love of God."

This is our parish mission and it defines who we are as a parish. It is a statement of our purpose and what we are pursuing.

Thinking about this, one cannot help but notice the relationship to what we have been learning about "Unleash the Gospel", the road map for the future of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Bringing Christ to others is exactly what unleashing the Gospel is all about. In doing that, we are living the love of God and hopefully they will also. We do this with Mary's powerful intercession.

This alignment of missions brings out an important point. While it is the individual who makes the commitment to missionary discipleship, it is the parish that plays a very critical role.

The parish provides food for our discipleship in the form of His Word and the Eucharist. And it is from the parish community we are able to: learn thorough homilies, faith development, and the testimonies of others; share ideas and encouragement; and join in prayer for our mission.

As we anticipate celebration of the Birth of Jesus, we also remember that it was Mary's "yes" that helped bring Christ into the world.

This was Mary's response to her invitation to discipleship. It was followed by other examples of her discipleship recorded in Scripture.

Mary has been called a model of discipleship and the first disciple. Her visit to her cousin Elizabeth was an act of outreach, an encounter. At Cana, Mary's involvement in her Son's miracle showed concern for others.

During Christ's passion and death, Mary's presence demonstrated her deep compassion for those who are suffering.

After the Ascension and awaiting the Holy Spirit, Mary and Christ's disciples prayed together. The gift of the Spirit empowered them to spread the Good News of our salvation.

That same Spirit is available to help us in our discipleship.

The 7th and 8th grade science students at Star are hard at work this quarter. We are exploring many topics within the theme of STREAM (science, technology, religion, engineering, art, and mathematics). I am very proud of the work and effort my students have put forth this year.





Currently we are investigating Cells in the 8^tgrade and Energy in the 7th grade. Thus far this year, 7th grade has explored topics in motion and force. They combined their engineering skills and knowledge on force and motion to build a Newton Scooter. This quarter they will use the engineering design process to build a small windmill. On the other hand, 8th grade began the year with chemistry and are now transitioning to the cell and the processes they undergo. Both classes, are challenged throughout the year to Identify where they witness OLSOS's vision statement: "Building Strong Minds and Faithful Hearts through Christ". In fact, the 8th grade created the front page of a newspaper where they had to not only write about where they see the vision statement being incorporated in the school but also discuss how a Catholic priest, brother, or nun dedicated their life to both Christ and to Science. Furthermore, this year's Invention Convention and Engineering Design projects will both require the students to reflect more deeply on "Building Strong Minds and Faithful Hearts through Christ."



In addition, the students will be using our newest technology, the 3D printer, in their Engineering Design project and their Invention Convention project. This technology as well as many of our science supplies would not be available if it weren't for your generous support of our students. Thank you!!!

I am truly blessed to be a part of the Star faith/school community and to work with budding scientists and leaders of the future.
