ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. **Adults over 21** need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Thanks to all of you who have been supportive of the parish in so many ways especially during the past 9 months of this pandemic. I especially applaud all of you who have been coming to church, even with some of your fears, and have been showing your care for one another. As I look out at those present for Mass I am very happy to see that people are wearing masks and keeping safe distance from

other households. (A reminder that masks are to be worn over the nose and mouth.) Such cooperation and care has made Star a place where many feel "safe" coming to Mass compared to other places.

As you know, Archbishop Vigneron has extended the dispensation of the Sunday and Holy Day obligation until Ash Wednesday, 2021. This dispensation is granted "so as not to unduly bind the consciences of those who are greatly troubled by the destructive potency of the coronavirus, and to care for the most vulnerable among us, such as the elderly. At the same time, one should not take advantage of the dispensation without a true need. Catholics who have already begun to engage in non-essential activities, such as widening one's social circle or going out to eat, should return to Sunday Mass – an essential activity – as church capacity allows."

Trying to plan for Christmas is challenging. Presuming our safe capacity will still be 50% or 250 people, with physical distance between households, how do we plan? It is hard to know if the usual crowds will stay away from Mass or if "tradition" will compel them to attend. There seems to be one solution that can be helpful and hopefully reduce some stress. We will be asking people to make a **reservation.** This can be done by you online or by calling the parish office if you do not have a computer or have difficulty maneuvering such programs. Please note: reservations will not begin until December 15th starting at 9:00am . When you register, you then print out your "ticket." It is also important to inform members of your family or invited guests they must wear a mask entering church, throughout the Mass, and leaving church. When the reservation system reaches the capacity of 250 people, you will then be placed on a waitlist and will be called if others cancel their reservation. We have never had to do this previously but it seems to be the only fair way this year. All of this is our best attempt to keep everyone safe by limiting the number, consistent wearing of masks, and keeping distance between households during our liturgies. [In between all the Masses we also have to disinfect the church in preparation for the following Mass.] Thank you for your cooperation and understanding. (See more information regarding this process elsewhere in the bulletin.)

** Archbishop Vigneron has announced the "Family of Parishes" for the Archdiocese of Detroit. Much has been written and it available on the AoD website for more complete information. Basically each "family" will have a team of clergy and lay ministers to shepherd and serve the needs of the parishes within the family. For the first number of years, there should be little change as each parish still maintains its own independence and finances. As the need changes over the years, appropriate measures will then be taken. [After we get through the Christmas season, more will be shared and explained as it relates to Star of the Sea,]

Here is what you need to know:

- Beginning Tuesday, Dec. 15 at 9 am, go to our website, www.olsos.org, to make reservations for your household or those willing to sit together at Mass. If you do not have access to the internet, call the parish office @313-884-5554 and we can assist you with reservations.
- Print your Eventbrite tickets or have them available on your phone. Bring them with you when you come to Mass so you may be seated with safe distancing.
- Doors will open 45 minutes prior to Mass. Please arrive no later then 15 minutes prior to Mass so people can be seated safely.
- Face masks, covering both nose and mouth, must be worn at all times entering, during, and leaving Mass. Please inform all guests of this requirement.
- **Deadline to register**: Eventbrite will remain open until 2 hours priors prior to Mass time or at Dec. 23 at noon if calling the parish office.
- Please use Eventbrite to *cancel your reservations* so others can register. If reservations were made through the parish office, please call the office.
- There are large white boxes in church for your Christmas Offering envelopes.
 We highly recommend online giving, please see our website at www.olsos.org/give
- Safe alternatives for high risk health individuals: If you are uncomfortable for any reason to be in a larger Christmas crowd, caring for a sick person, or feeling sick yourself, consider watching our livestreamed Masses or a Mass on TV. You may also feel more comfortable at a Mass with fewer people. Saturday, Dec. 26 at 4 pm or Sunday at 8, 9:30 or 11:30 am are good alternatives for you.

Good — Apostolic Boldness

Archbishop Allen Vigneron has encouraged us to be innovative and confident. He urges us to dismiss temptations towards fear and lethargy. Now he calls us to APOSTOLIC BOLDNESS. What does he mean by that?


To find out, we only have to turn to the beginning of the Church, recorded in Acts of the Apostles. Apostolic Boldness is to proclaim the truth about Jesus with the same faith and zeal that the Twelve Apostles demonstrated themselves after the Holy Spirit descended upon them at Pentecost. From that moment on the Apostles, who had previously been cowards, proclaimed what they had seen without hesitation, even in the face of hostility. From Pentecost onward, the Holy Spirit has not left the Church! He is still here, able to work the same wonders and move peoples' hearts just as He did back then.
