In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



When people are asked what is most important to them, the most common responses are God and family. In today's feast of the Holy Family we have the model for Christian families.

It is through families that we pass the faith from one generation to the next. In addition, strong families are needed in order to have good communities and societies.

However, today's culture presents many difficult challenges for both parents and children. The expectations are particularly high and the negative influences can be great.

That is why one of the aims of our archdiocesan plan is to support families in their faith journey. A major section on families says they are "at the very heart of our efforts to unleash the Gospel because they are the first and most

important setting in which evangelization takes place." Families have a significant role in building up the Church, the Body of Christ.

Pope Francis has stressed that love and prayer are keys to strong family life. Using the words "please", "thank you", and "sorry" are important, he says. Other thoughts he has include having patience, keeping peace in the family, and remembering no family is perfect, but must continue to grow in love.

He always mentions praying as a family and praying for families. His prayer intention for the month of August was that "families, through their life of prayer and love, become ever more clearly schools of true human development".
