

This Thursday, we begin **Alpha**. You have seen it advertised for some time now but maybe you might still be undecided and need some extra information. Alpha is a program that has been run all around the world. It obviously has been not only popular but meaningful in the lives of thousands of people. Alpha is a series of sessions that explores the Christian faith. It normally runs for 10 or 11

sessions. Each 30-minute talk looks at a different question, or questions, about life, faith, or God and ultimately is designed to create conversation. It can answer questions you, or someone close to you, might be dealing with. It might even raise more thought-provoking questions but will also lead you to life giving answers!

Who is this for? It is for everyone! Whether you are a cradle Catholic, someone who has drifted from the faith or the practice of religion, or someone who has been wanting to know more about Jesus and faith.

We begin the evening with a little meal, doing our best with what can be done safely during this Covid time! As you experience in your own homes, food is something that not only brings people together but helps to build the family and community. We then watch the brief presentation followed by some discussion. Those who have participated in Alpha in other parishes have found it very helpful and enlightening, even sprouting a renewal in faith for them and their family.

Everyone is welcome!

** Our parish will participate in a special collection to support the archdiocesan Priests' Retirement Fund at all the Masses next weekend, Sept. 25-26. Your generous response to this collection, With Thanks for Their Service in Christ, would be a sign of gratitude for those faithful priests who have served the Lord during their "working" years.

The reason for the collection is simple. Having been established only in the early 1970's, the pension fund today is not fully funded. At its inception, the parish Christmas collection used to go to the archdiocesan priests' retirement fund. When the CSA started, it then received its income from the CSA. Since 1994, each parish has been assessed an annual amount, currently about \$18,000 per priest. In the Archdiocese, we are currently blessed to have about 100 senior priests who are no longer assigned to a parish, many of whom continue to minister to parishes as the need arises. At the age of 70, our priests begin receiving from the Priests' Retirement Fund health insurance benefits, care insurance and a \$1,500 monthly pension (from which he has to pay rent, food, utilities, and all other normal personal and household items).

If you can help with this collection, it would be very much appreciated. Any gift is a blessing! Thank you for your consideration.

Hello! My name is Fr. Jeremy Davis, S.O.L.T. and I've had the privilege of serving at Santa Maria del Mexicano for six years. For over 40 years Santa Maria has been a home and a family to the poor, disadvantaged, neglected and abandoned youth of Mexico. The mission also includes a home for the

elderly who come from challenging life situations.

Santa Maria is served by my religious community: the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity (S.O.L.T.). I serve as the assistant director of the institution and as the director of the house for the middle school and high school boys. Santa Maria is a private, Catholic institution that offers elementary, middle school, and high school education to children without any resources or options. Our children learn vocational skills and some are even offered the opportunity to study in college.

Witnessing God's goodness in these children and sharing the person of Jesus Christ with them are my greatest joys. Their traumatic life experiences cannot stifle or suppress God's goodness in them. Our heavenly Father preserves their innocence and reveals it in their smiles. Praying with them, offering Mass for them, teaching them, accompanying them to the doctor, teaching them soccer, cutting their hair have become the beautiful gifts to me that form us in the family of God. Each day these children teach me to be a disciple, a dad, and a spiritual father. Thank you for being part of our family.



About today's hymns:

Our opening hymn today, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty," was written by Joachim Neander, a seventeenth century German school teacher and headmaster who, after a very unruly youth (one thinks of

St Augustine, and how he in his youth was also led quite an unhinged life!) had a deep conversion, shepherded by his pastor who saw in him great potential. Neader dug deep into the study of the scriptures and organized devotional groups for prayer and Bible study. A gifted writer, he became a prolific author of hymns, so much so that he is regarded as one of the leading hymn writers of his time.

Neander lived in the Dussel valley in Germany, and was a lover of nature and loved to go on hikes during which he wrote many of his hymns. The opening words of our opening hymn, "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation" certainly stem from and were most likely written one of his hikes in this beautiful valley.

Neander's life was cut short at the age of 30, when he died of tuberculosis. His regard was such that the Dussel valley where he hiked was named Neanderthal ("Neander Valley") in his honor, and it was in this valley that in the summer of 1856 archaeologists found fossilized remnants of a human being and they were named "Neanderthal Man."

This great hymn of praise has stood the test of time; from its opening lines expressing joy in God's creation, it quickly unfolds as a testimony to God's abiding care and graciousness, something Neander felt deeply as he grew from his unruly youth into a person of deep faith.

The tune originally was composed for another text, but soon became attached to Neander's hymn as it is a perfect match for the contours of the text. Both today's opening voluntary and closing voluntary are settings of this tune; both pieces radiate the joy that characterizes this tune. Both composers have the tune played by the feet, with the hands spinning out delightful garlands inspired by both the joy of the tune and the joy of the text.

The text of our communion hymn, "You Satisfy the Hungry Heart," was written by Omar Westendorf, one of the leading post-Vatican II hymn writers and one of the earliest lyricists for liturgical music in English. Westendorf spent most of his career at St. Bonaventure Church in Cincinnati, Ohio, and wrote many pieces for St. Bonaventure's. He got his start in music publishing when interest grew in making his works more readily available, operating out of his garage.

The tune is by Robert Kreutz, who composed it for the International Eucharistic Congress in 1976 in Philadelphia. One of the prominent features of hymns immediately after Vatican II is a memorable and singable refrain, reflecting the emphasis being placed on enabling the assembly to participate more fully in their singing.

This hymn, which is replete with biblical references, quickly became a classis because of the 1976 Congress. The refrain echoes John 6: 25-37, a passage where Christ develops the imagery of bread. Stanza one focuses on the metaphor of Christ as Shepherd from several passages, especially from John 10. Stanza three is almost a direct quotation of I Corinthians 10: 16-17, and the final stanza calls us to live lives of service and charity.

Stewardship Thoughts

In today's reading from the Book of Wisdom, the wicked plot the death of the "just one". They wanted to see if God will take care of Him. This passage prefigures Christ's suffering, mocking, and death, as Jesus tells His disciples in St. Mark's Gospel. The Scripture readings from St. James and St. Mark warn against false ambition and seeking rank instead of looking to serve the Lord. These attitudes cause division among Christ's followers. With humility, Jesus explains that true discipleship requires the first to be last and servants of all. As Christian stewards, how is the Lord asking us to serve Him? To answer this question, spend some quiet time daily to open your heart and clear your mind to listen to what the Lord asks of you.


