Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life.

When we think of "Respect Life" month and "the dignity of human life" we most likely think of protecting life from conception until natural death. We pray for those thinking about abortion, those who are directly involved with abortion and the taking of human life. That is a very important and undeniable focus.

Given our present state of society and culture, I would like to think about "every human life." I see an increase of disrespect for people, an increase of downright rudeness. This has also been expressed by popular columnists, other ministers and professionals in all aspects of life. This is communicated through emails, words, letters, social media and personal interaction. I suspect the disrespect and meanness comes from an increase of deep seated anger, frustration, self-centeredness and a bit of fatigue. Not getting our way does not give us the right to be rude, disrespectful and mean to others. We have different opinions but we still need to respect each other, all life, being created in the image and likeness of God.

Let us continue to pray for each other this month with greater fervor and intention. Let us remember the peace in our life, our community, and our world begins with us. Recalling St. Francis of Assisi, whose feast we celebrate Monday, and the hymn we all know so well, "make me a channel of your peace... where there is hatred let me bring love...".

#### Lord of all, to You we raise, this our hymn of grateful praise

Our opening hymn this weekend, "For the Beauty of the Earth," was originally written as a Communion hymn, with the refrain orig-

inally being "Christ, our God, to Thee we raise this our sacrifice of praise," referring to the Eucharistic sacrifice. The author of this hymn, Folliott Sandford Pierpoint lived from 1835 to 1917, and was born in Bath, England. After attending college he was for a brief period a school headmaster and taught literature, but after receiving a small inheritance he spent the remainder of his life traveling and writing. He wrote many hymns and sacred poems in seven volumes, many of which dealt with his love of nature, as evidenced in the first two stanzas of this hymn. As he moves beyond the first two stanzas, he lifts up the "joy of ear and eye" and the "mystic harmony," linking all to our Creator, and continues to the joy of human love, culminating with the Church lifting up the Sacrifice of love, meaning the Sacrifice at the altar.

It is said that he wrote this hymn "one day in late spring near his native city of Bath, England, when the flowers were in full bloom and all the earth seemed to rejoice. He climbed up a hill and sat down to rest and meditate," and then was inspired to write these lines. In England this hymn is widely used as a children's hymn because of its imagery, and is a favorite there for flower services, which are held on the afternoon of the fourth Sunday in Lent, a Sunday called "Mothering Sunday," which not only is an equivalent to the American Mothers' Day, but also is a mid-point in the season of Lent.

Originally the fifth stanza read, "For Thy Bride" instead of "For Your Church," referring to the Church as the Bride of Christ.

Of note are two stanzas that are no longer included in hymnbooks, the first pointing us to martyrs, prophets, and confessors, and the second the Blessed Virgin Mary and Christ's presence in the Eucharist:

For Thy Martyrs' crown of light,
For Thy Prophets' eagle eye,
For Thy bold Confessors' might,
For the lips of Infancy:
CHRIST, our GOD, to Thee we raise
This our Sacrifice of Praise.

For Thy Virgins' robes of snow,
For Thy Maiden Mother mild,
For Thyself, with hearts aglow,
JESU, Victim undefiled,
Offer we at Thine own Shrine
Thyself, sweet Sacrament Divine.


Eucharistic Ministers are asked to go to the Sacristy after Mass to assist with washing the vessels used at Mass.
