November has traditionally been a time in the Church when we pause and become more mindful of our beloved faithful departed. The Church provides very fitting readings as we will hear more about the end of time and harvesting of all the souls by God.

On Monday, Nov. 1, we celebrate the **Feast of All Saints**. God's saints come in all sizes, shapes, colors and

ages. Some saints are remembered and known by name. However, most are unknown to us. So this is the day we celebrate the countless unknown and uncelebrated saints who have done the work of God in every age. While this year the Feast of All Saints is *not a day of obligation*, it is still a Holyday. (A few years ago the US bishops decided if All Saints fell on the Saturday or Monday they would dispense from the obligation.) Please join us for Mass at 7:30 am or at 7:00 pm.

Tuesday is the **Commemoration of All Souls**, a companion celebration to All Saints day. All Souls Day is a solemn memorial for all the departed Christians who were not exemplary saints or martyrs. On All Saints Day we celebrated, for our benefit, our union with those holy men and women whose good deed can assist us on this earthly journey. On All Souls Day, we ask that our prayers may somehow assist those who have died, especially those in Purgatory. As has been the custom, we will have a special Mass of Remembrance at 7:00 pm. At this Mass, we will remember in a special way, through the reading of names, all those buried from Star of the Sea during the last 12 months. We will also remember all those who are inscribed in the Book of Life. [The Book of Life is available in the gathering space so that you may inscribe the names of your departed loved ones who have died during the past year. The names previously inscribed in previous years are still in the book so there is no need to duplicate names.] Everyone is invited to this special evening Mass and pray for all the faithful departed.

- ** What a joy it was to celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick last weekend! My hope is that all those who witnessed it also found it as a sign of hope and comfort to know the Church provides this prayer at the time of serious illness or surgery, not just simply in the last minutes or hours of someone's death. I know first hand the peace people experience after receiving it.
- ** Concert and organ lovers mark your calendars for Friday, Nov. 19 at 7:30 pm. We will commemorate the 20th anniversary of the dedication of our renown church organ with a special concert featuring three outstanding organists. We are very pleased that Dr. Ronald Prowse, who played the dedication concert 20 years ago, will again perform. Matthew Jakubisin, our previous music minister and now the organist at St. Andrew Cathedral in Grand Rapids, has agreed to perform as well as our present organist, Glenn Miller. Soprano and cantor Angela Theis will also join in the grand celebration!

Pray hard and strive for sainthood...because that is what we are called to be!

For all the saints, who from their labors rest...

On All Saints' Day (November) our cornerstone hymn for our Masses is the great hymn (no. 889 in *RitualSong*), "For All the Saints." This hymn was written William Walsham How, a bishop in the Church of England for All

Saints' Day, 1864, which he wrote as a commentary on the phrase, "I believe in the communion of saints" from the Apostles' Creed. When it was first published it was titled "Saints Day Hymn – Cloud of Witnesses – Hebrews 12: 1." Originally conceived as a processional hymn for a very large cathedral, How's text draws on a nostalgic conception of military pageantry celebrating the glories of battle culminating in a well-earned rest. Its content however far transcends this conception.

The hymn text is very comprehensive, with its eight stanzas. Originally it was even longer, with three additional stanzas:

For the Apostles' glorious company,

Who bearing forth the Cross o'er land and sea,

Shook all the mighty world, we sing to thee: Alleluia!

For the Evangelists, by whose pure word,
Like fourfold streams, the garden of the Lord
Is fair and fruitful, be thy Name adored: Alleluia!

For Martyrs who, with rapture-kindled eye,
Saw the bright crown descending from the sky
And, seeing, grasped it, thee we glorify: Alleluia!

Don't worry – we won't being singing the hymn in its entirety as one of our hymns for our All Saints' Masses, but we will be dividing it up between the opening, presentation, and closing hymns. Scripturally it is packed full of scripture references, including Colossians 1: 12-13; Matthew 10: 32; Romans 10: 9; Psalm 61: 2-3; I Timothy 6: 12; Ephesians 6: 10-17; II Timothy 4: 7-8; Daniel 12: 3; Matthew 12: 43; John 17: 9-11; and finally Revelation 7: 1-17 and 21: 1 – 22: 5. What a thorough and comprehensive statement of faith! Bishop How certainly knew the riches of Holy Scripture and the elements of the Faith.

The tune wasn't composed until 1906, and is regarded as one of the greatest hymn tunes of the twentieth century. It was composed by the great and highly prolific English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, who at the time of the tune's composition was the musical editor of the *English Hymnal*, a hymnal which set the standard for hymnals in the twentieth century. The name of the tune, "Sine nomine" means simply "without a name", which perhaps was because Vaughan Williams, despite his being musical editor for the *English Hymnal*, submitted it anonymously to the editorial board for consideration. As a hymn tune it is unique because of its walking bass line, something which was very uncharacteristic of hymn tunes, and because of this rather revolutionary step it was initially rejected as being "jazz music." This walking bass line gives the tune a solid grounding, reinforcing its purpose as a tune for a grand and lengthy processional and even military pageantry.

Looking ahead – Friday, November 19, 7:30: A Celebration of the Twentieth Anniversary of the Star Pipe Organ, featuring organists Dr. Ronald Prowse, retired Director of Music of Sacred Heart Major Seminary and the recitalist for when the organ was dedicated; Matt Jakubisan, former Star Music Minister and presently Director of Music at the Cathedral of St. Andrew, Grand Rapids; Glenn Miller, and soprano Angela Theis Kelly. The concert will display all of the many tonal colors of the instrument, including the delightful *Zimbelstern*, the bell star that turns when in use. All are welcome, a free-will offering will be received.




