This week I hope we will put aside time to give God thanks for the many blessings we have received from Him and from others. (Hopefully our gratitude and thanksgiving lasts more than on Thanksgiving Day!) I think it is also appropriate for such thanks as we celebrate the great Feast of Christ the King this weekend while getting ready for the Advent Season which begins next Sunday.

I thank God for you and the gift of faith He has given to each one of us. Our faith is such a tremendous resource when we are faced with challenges, difficulties, and doubts. I know I am blessed being here at Star and being a part of your life. {You undoubtedly have noticed I often prefer to stay and quietly work on the sidelines, off stage, in the kitchen, not in the forefront. # UNWRAPPING ADVENT

Prepare room for Christ this season - in your home and in your heart.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 30
7:00 - 8:00 PM IN THE CHURCH

Join us for an evening of fellowship, reflection, and activities, readying ourselves for a meaningful Advent. All are welcome!





Come, let us sing to the Lord...let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song. (Psalm 95: 1, 2)

This is one of many verses in the Psalms in which the faithful are commended (and even commanded) to sing, and how singing, whether by choirs or the assembly, is integral to the act of worship. For those who are not actively in a choir but might even classify one's self as being a "non-singer," meaning that for them singing is a talent which has been bestowed on them, the very act of singing certainly calls one out their comfort zone, and feels like a burden or a cross one would rather not bear.

One of the greatest joys for me in the liturgy is accompanying the assembly in its song, whether it be the hymns or the pieces in the Mass called the Ordinary (the "Glory to God in the Highest," or the "Holy, Holy," or the "Lamb of God.") Know that hearing you all sing together gladdens my heart and the hearts of all gathered together, enriches the Sacred Liturgy, and connects us with the angels singing around the Heavenly Throne.

In accompanying hymns the role the accompanist has is to be encouraging. This is done by how one plays the organ or piano, through the selection of sounds that are used to support the assembly, which should never be blatant or strident but always smooth and usually sustained. Have you noticed that often times the melody is being soloed out on the organ? This is one of the simplest but most effective ways to help inspire and lead congregational singing.

By our engaging fully in singing we connect ourselves with the admonition of the Psalmist. Jesus Himself was a singer, as he sang the Psalms and the liturgy with His disciples and in the Temple. Imagine – some of the texts we sing, specifically the Psalms, were actually sung by Our Lord!

Singing actually is something most everyone can do, though in this day and age it is something that isn't part of everyday life in the home as it was a couple of generations ago, when for entertainment families would gather around the piano (every home had one) and sing, young and old, together. Still, everyone knows and sings such commonplace songs in family life, such as "Happy Birthday," or at Christmas time familiar carols, or hymns such as "Amazing Grace," or national songs such as "My country, 'tis of thee."

Singing binds a community together, and with simple, regular exercise one's voice becomes stronger and able. It is a physical act that requires attention to one's posture, breath, aural and mental focus in order for the skill and one's confidence to grow. Just as going to the gym regularly tones the muscles of one's body and strengthens one's physical health, so to does working at one's singing make one's ability to sing grown in confidence and strength.

Each Friday before school Mass I engage all of the students (and the teachers!) in some vocal warm ups to not only prepare and better equip them for their participation in the liturgy but also to strengthen their singing skills. Hearing how these skills and confidence have grown in the past few months since school began is such a great joy.

We start with focusing on posture, sitting tall and at the edge of their seats, as there is a direct connection between how one holds one's instrument – which is their entire body – and what kind of sound is made. We then do some exercises to energize and manage their breath flow, as in order for a voice to sound the breath has to be steady and even. Next we make sounds, opening up the high and low ranges of the voice, and then sustain a unison pitch – usually the note A or B flat above middle C, - getting everyone to listen to make sure everyone is on key and making a beautiful, smooth sound. It is such a joy hearing all of the voices sounding "spot on" making this sound; not only does it teach everyone how to listen but it also reminds us that we are part of a one community. To finish we sing a part of one of the hymns that will be sung in the liturgy.

When you, the assembly, are called upon to sing in worship, I encourage you to:

be aware of how you hold your body. Sit or stand tall, and make sure you take a good, deep breath before you sing.

Your breath is what powers your voice, and without a good breath your voice simply won't work!


be bold and go for it!

Recently at the weeknight rehearsal of the Star Choir, the following words about singing by the great 18th century English Methodist pastor John Wesley were shared. Wesley wrote them not for a choir, but for congregations in their worship:

1. Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a single degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up, and you will find it a blessing.

- 2. Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength.
- 3. Sing modestly. Strive to unite your voices together, so as to make one

clear melodious sound.

- 4. Sing in time. Whatever time is sung be sure to keep with it.
- 5. Above all sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing him more than yourself, or any other creature. In order to do this attend strictly to the sense of what you sing, and see that your heart is not carried away with the sound, but offered to God continually; so shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve here, and reward you when he cometh in the clouds of heaven.

So, in the words of the Psalmist, "I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have my being."


