We are now in the final six days of the Advent season. The days of Christmas will be here soon. Even in these challenging times, we have probably done much during these past weeks to prepare for Christmas through our decorating, shopping, baking, cooking and much more. Now more than ever is the time to focus on Jesus and the joy that we should have as the Word of God becomes flesh for us.

There are many little ways in which we can certainly keep the focus of Christ in Christmas. For instance, if you still have some gifts to wrap, say a little prayer for the person who will receive the gift. Think about their good qualities and characteristics. Think of little ways you might continue to help them throughout the year. Maybe a note or phone call every now and then. As you might receive gifts from others and place them under your tree, thank God for the gift of these people in your life. How in some way have they brought you closer to Jesus? How do they challenge you through their lives to be a bit more Christ-like in yours?

The legend of the Christmas tree in our home is meant to remind us of the connection of heaven and earth as the tree points straight up with the star or angel on top and the village or nativity under the tree. Let the lights of your tree remind you of the acts of kindness needed to help transform our individual lives and the world. If you have your nativity set under the tree, lay on the floor with the children (you might need them later to help you get up!) and talk about the awe of Christ's birth and the wonder of heaven. Look at the amazement on the faces of your children and thank God for the blessings and gifts children bring to us. Thank God for the great gift of the baby that has brought all of us salvation and grace – the Christ Child!

Take these last days of Advent to **Prepare Him Room**. As the Christmas season begins at 4pm on Friday afternoon, may we continue to be a blessing to all we encounter and keep Christ as the reason for the season!

- ** Please remember that church might likely be crowded for Christmas. Yes, many of the people here are not parishioners but probably family members of parishioners that are proud of our church and parish. By all means wear a mask if it makes you feel a bit more safe. Patience, consideration and hospitality are always good virtues to practice. I do have to remind you to please observe the **no parking areas** with the slanted yellow strips near the main entrance of the church. This is to guarantee accessibility for emergency vehicles and is not for handicapped vehicles.
- ** I have taken a few questions already about Christmas being on Saturday this year. In specific, some wanted to know if going to church on Christmas is good for the weekend. (My first response was, "excuse me?") So let's be clear. The Church teaches that we have the responsibility, the obligation, to participate in the Eucharist (Mass) each and every Sunday. No where does it say to participate in Mass once a week, or on some days close to Sunday, like Friday or Monday, or when we don't have sports, shopping or other things. That being said, Christmas is Christmas, a Holyday of Obligation. So "going to Mass" on Christmas, whether it is after 4 pm on Christmas Eve or Christmas morning, fulfills one's obligation for Christmas. It has nothing to do with Sunday. "Going to Mass" on Sunday morning fulfills the obligation for Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Family. So sorry to disappoint many of you but this year it is "going to church" Friday afternoon/evening or Saturday morning and then coming back on Sunday morning. (Next year will be easier since Christmas is on Sunday!)
- ** Please note: after 3:30 pm people will no longer be able to save seats in the church in consideration of the people who are coming in to the church. At some point when the crowd for the 4 pm Mass in church reaches its capacity, the doors will be locked (usually shortly after 3:30 pm) and others will be directed to the 4:15 Mass in the gym.
- ** Thanks to the choir and all the liturgical ministers at this time of year! We appreciate your service now and throughout the year.

- ** Thanks to all of you who have done so much to make our parish so beautiful and so alive. Be sure to spread the word and invite others to be with us! Remember that any donations for the "Christmas collection" must be marked **Christmas**, or in the special Christmas envelope, and/or dated as such.
- ** There will be one more chance this week to go to confession: Tuesday from 7- 8:30 pm in church.
- ** Please be extra careful driving out there these days and weeks. We all know that we more often need to look after the other drivers than ourselves.
- ** Many thanks to all of you who offered Christmas greetings, blessings, prayers, cookies or other gifts. Your kindness and thoughtfulness is so very much appreciated. It is a great honor and privilege being here to serve you, being a part of your family and I very much appreciate the opportunity to serve you. Know that you are in my prayers and the Masses I celebrate.

May you be touched by the powerful presence of the Lord as we prepare and celebrate His coming!

People, Look East!

People, look east. The time is near Of the crowning of the year. Make your house fair as you are able, Trim the hearth and set the table. People, look east and sing today: Love, the Guest, is on the way.



Our closing hymn, People, Look East, was written by Eleanor Farjeon, a noted and award winning twentieth century English author of more than eighty children's books. She grew up in a very literate home, surrounded by books and a talented circle of artists, writers, and musicians, and was encouraged at a very young age by her parents to be a writer.

Reflective of her vivid imagination, this hymn is filled with key images of the Advent season. People, Look East is the direction of the rising sun and, in the history of Christianity, the direction of the coming Messiah bringing light into the world. In stanza two, the bare earth is waiting for the seed that will flourish in the reign of the Promised One. In stanza three, "Love, the Bird" is a reference to the Holy Spirit coming into the world. In stanza four, the stars that guided the Magi shape the "bowl" of the heavens, giving signs of hope beyond "the frosty weather." The angels' song, in stanza five, sets "every peak and valley humming," an oblique reference to Isaiah 40:4, "Every valley shall be exalted and every mountain and hill brought low. . ."

This joyful Advent hymn has the spirit of a Christmas carol, but with an imaginative Advent text. Singing this carol is indeed one way to prepare both our homes and hearts for the coming of the Savior.


