



I danced in the morning...

Our presentation hymn, "I danced in the morning," (no. 809) was written by English songwriter Sydney Carter in 1963. Carter was a leader in the church

folk song movement of the 1960's. The text is naturally thick with biblical references, with allusions in almost every line. It is also helpful to keep in mind that this hymn affirms what could be called a Dance of Life in opposition to the Dance of Death motif that received much attention in European culture from the late Middle Ages onward, emphasizing instead that the Good News centers on the gift of life.

The song follows the idea of the traditional English carol "Tomorrow shall be my dancing day", which tells the gospel story in the first-person voice of Jesus of Nazareth with the device of portraying Jesus' life and mission as a dance.

The melody is adapted from the American Shaker song "Simple Gifts," and comes from the Shakers, which was a religious movement which originated during an English revival in 1747. The name "Shaker" came from the shaking that occurred during the stress of the spiritual exaltation the members of the sect experienced in their meetings. Shunned by English society, the Shakers emigrated to America in 1774 and established communities in New York and New England, living separately from society. The Shakers espoused egalitarian ideals, practiced a celibate and communal utopian lifestyle, pacifism, and were also know for their simple living, architecture, technological innovation, music, and furniture. This tune was originally sung to "Tis a gift to be simple," also known as "Simple Gifts," which reflects the simple lifestyle of the Shakers. The tune became widely known through its inclusion in American composer Aaron Copland's ballet, *Appalachian Spring*.

About this hymn Carter wrote:

I see Christ as the incarnation of the piper who is calling us. He dances that shape and pattern which is at the heart of our reality... I sing of the dancing pattern in the life and words of Jesus.

Whether Jesus ever leaped in Galilee to the rhythm of a pipe or drum I do not know. We are told that David danced (and as an act of worship too), so it is not impossible. The fact that many Christians have regarded dancing as a bit ungodly (in a church, at any rate) does not mean that Jesus did. The Shakers didn't. Their hymns were odd, but sometimes of great beauty: from one of these ("Simple Gifts") I adapted this melody. I could have written another [melody] for the words of 'Lord of the Dance' (some people have), but this was so appropriate that it seemed a waste of time to do so. Also, I wanted to salute the Shakers. Sometimes, for a change I sing the whole song in the present tense. 'I dance in the morning when the world is begun...'. It's worth a try. — Sydney Carter (1915-2004), Green Print for Dance

You Walk Along Our Shoreline

Our closing hymn, "You walk along our shoreline," (no. 807) was written by Sylvia Dunstan, a twentieth century Canadian hymn writer who was active in prison ministry and had a deep passion for liturgy. She attributed her love of song to her grandparents, and she received her formal musical education from nuns at a local convent. Recognizing her skills as a poet, she was encouraged by Sister Miriam Theresa Winter to focus her efforts in writing hymns. The author of more than 45 hymns, she died at the age of 38 from liver cancer.

Stewardship Thoughts

A theme of answering God's "call" connects today's Scripture readings. In a vision, the prophet Isaiah sees the glory of God revealed in the Temple and responds to the Lord, *Here I am ... send me!* In St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthian community, he professes his unworthiness of Jesus' call: *Last of all, as to one abnormally born, He [Christ] appeared to me.* Following the miraculous catch of fish described in St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus summons Simon-Peter, James, and John to follow Him. They do, giving up everything. Are we responding to God's call — in a spirit of evangelization, employing our God-given gifts in prayer, service, and generosity — to make *disciples of all nations*? To encourage religious vocations, please pray for the "Domestic Church." Christ-centered families provide fertile ground for vocations. In addition, consider being charitable with your time and talent to a local Serra group or your parish vocation committee and, in addition, read *Gift and Mystery*, the book Pope St. John Paul II wrote on the 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.
