Believe it or not Lent is right around the corner! So know what to do? What should change? What NEEDS to change? If you are not giving up something, are you going to DO something that can be helpful and life changing to make you a better Christian? There is so much to do that can be relatively easy as long a you make the commitment, just like anything we make a priority. Even if you commit 6 minutes a day it will make a

difference in your life.

You will find in this paper our Lent centerfold that you can easily remove and keep on your home bulletin board, or refrigerator or wherever you post items to remember and motivate you. It includes so much information to help you live Lent in such a good and productive way this year! In addition to all that you see, remember the gift you have as a parishioner. It is a gift that brings to your home, any time and any day, a wealth of information and formation. I am talking about FORMED, a great website filled with great movies, documentaries, lectures, music, bible studies and much more. And Star of the Sea has made it FREE for you! If you are embarrassed that you might be little short of your knowledge of scripture, faith, or understanding Church doctrine, this is a great place to learn more of what you want, and whenever you want, in the privacy of your own home! Here is what you have to do. Go to www.olsos.formed.org. If you are new to the site, simply set up your own "account" with your own login information and that's it! (If you already have an account, simply login.) Why not check it out this week? It will only take a few minutes to set up and then you are good to go. I think you will be amazed with everything that is at your disposal, for adults, youth, and children, for free, provided to you by your parish!

Here is a reminder about this Wednesday. Ashes will be distributed **after the homily**, *not* at the end of the Mass or service. So if you arrive 8 minutes after the start of Mass or service, you will most likely miss the opportunity to receive ashes. Receiving ashes is a good way to begin Lent and remind ourselves of the humility needed to submit ourselves to God and that we are at His service and not that He serves us!

- \*\* Spending time in front of the Blessed Sacrament is priceless. Not only is there some good silence (which we all need to have in our life) but the space to hear the Lord talking to us! Spend some time in our chapel and starting March 9th we will have Adoration on Wednesdays from 8am—10am.
- \*\* Receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) is also a key element during Lent. Additional individual times have been added during Lent to hopefully accommodate a few more humble penitents.
- \*\* Can't wait for the Fish Fry? It has been almost too years since we had one and I know I am excited, as well as many of you. There will be a few different changes this year but still a great opportunity to come, or take home, some good food and enjoy some fellowship.
- \*\* Last year we alternated the time of the Friday Stations of the Cross between 2:30 pm and 7 pm. It seemed to be helpful to many people so we will again follow that format this year. However, when Stations are not scheduled on a Friday night, we will still have the booklets out for those who desire to pray them privately after the Fish Fry.




# Lenten Family Challenge!



Welcome, Ron and Cathy Prowse, who are our guest music ministers this weekend, as Glenn Miller is in Portland, Oregon, performing and recording

music by Estonian composer Arvo Pärt with the professional Grammy nominated ensemble, Cappella Romana. Ron was for many years Director of Music at Sacred Heart Major Seminary, where he continues to teach. Ron was one of the guest organists this past fall for the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the Star organ, having been the dedicatory recitalist when the organ was inaugurated. Cathy has served for many years as music minister in parishes in the metropolitan area.

About the composer Arvo Pärt and his music: Pärt is Estonian, where choral singing is central to the country's culture. Born in 1935, he suffered greatly because of the Soviet establishment, which propelled him to enter into a state of complete despair. Coming out of this state, he found his voice through the deepening of his Orthodox faith, with his musical language becoming increasingly simple and minimal, inspired in part by Gregorian chant and characterized by the use of silence. His music is very atmospheric, mystical, timeless, and transcendent. On 10 December 2011, Pope Benedict XVI appointed him a member of the Pontifical Council for Culture, and from 2011 to 2018, he was the most performed living composer in the world. About silence and sound, he writes:

The silence must be longer. This music is about the silence. The sounds are there to surround the silence.

You can kill people with sound. And if you can kill, then maybe there is also the sound that is opposite of killing. And the distance between these two points is very big. And you are free--you can choose. In art everything is possible, but everything is not necessary.

The human voice is the most perfect instrument of all.

When asked how Estonian he felt his music to be, Pärt replied: "I don't know what is Estonian... I don't think about these things." Unlike many of his fellow Estonian composers, Pärt never found inspiration in the country's epic poem, Kalevipoeg, even in his early works. Pärt said, "My Kalevipoeg is Jesus Christ." Youtube has many examples of his works; highly recommended are the recordings there of his setting of the Nunc dimittis (Song of Simeon) sung by Voces8, and Spiegel am Spiegel for cello, both exhibiting timelessness and transcendence.

#### About one of today's hymns:

Our opening hymn, *Gather us in* (Ritual Song, no. 850), was written by contemporary Catholic liturgical music composer Marty Haugen in 1983, and is a prayer to God on behalf of the community of believers. It is rich in scriptural allusions, including Genesis 1: 1-5, 2 Corinthians 5: 17, Psalm 27: 8, Sirach 44: 1-15, Isaiah 42: 6 and 49: 6, Matthew 5: 14, Psalm 51: 10, and Ezekiel 11: 19, plus many other Biblical allusions, attesting not only to the skill of the author but most importantly the author's thorough knowledge of the Bible.

#### **Stewardship Thoughts**

Today's Scripture passages focus on "good fruit." In the reading from the Book of Sirach, the prophet states, The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had .... The evangelist St. Paul, in his First Letter to the Corinthians, encourages them: ... be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. Jesus, in St. Luke's Gospel, proclaims: A good tree does not bear rotten fruit ... for every tree is known by its own fruit. How do we prepare, as disciples in Christ, to bear good fruit for the Kingdom? As good stewards, are we making quiet time for daily prayer and Scripture study that draws us to a closer friendship in Jesus? Are we attending Mass every weekend in order to receive the true Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ in the Eucharist? As a result, in a spirit of evangelization, do we share our love, peace, and joy in Christ with those we encounter to help produce "good fruit" in them? 
