

This is another example of the Lord walking with us as we open our sinful hearts to God and receive his mercy.

Tom Clark serves in the Department of Evangelization and Missionary Discipleship for the Archdiocese. Tom provides a diverse ministry through music presentations for parishes.









Stewardship Thoughts

In today's Scripture readings, from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians and St. Luke's Gospel, a theme of repentance emerges. St. Paul advises the Corinthian community to not repeat the sinful ways of their ancestors in the wilderness with Moses. Due to their evil actions and refusal to repent, many of the ancient Israelites did not reach the Promised Land. In the Gospel, Jesus is very clear about the need for repentance. We can be assured that God extends compassion, mercy, and patience to sinners, but Jesus warns us in His parable of the fig tree, a "tree" that fails to produce the fruit of repentance is cut down. Good and faithful stewards acknowledge Lent as a time of repentance, a time to celebrate God's gift of forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Never be afraid to seek the love and mercy of God, who proclaims to Moses in the Book of Exodus, I am Who am. Experience Jesus' healing grace this Lent through Confession.

About today's hymns

Our opening hymn, "Lift High the Cross" (Ritual Song, 884) was written in 1887 for use at a Society for the Propagation of the Gospel Festival in Winchester Ca-

thedral, England. In its original form it consists of twelve (!) stanzas and was sung as a processional hymn around the entire cathedral, whose nave (the area where the assembled people sit) is the longest in England, which may explain why it was necessary to have twelve stanzas. The hymn was enjoyed immediate popularity in England, but it wasn't until the latter part of the twentieth century that it found its way to the United States. The text is rich in biblical and baptismal imagery Its tune name, Crucifer, is both literal and figurative. In the former sense, its Latin meaning, "cross bearer," applies to the person leading the procession with a processional cross. But the term also applies more generally, as the third stanza reminds, to all Christians, who bear the cross by virtue of their baptism and whenever one make the sign of the Cross.

Our communion hymn, "In This Place" (Spirit Song, 122) is by Trevor Thomson, a contemporary Catholic musician and composer. He has worked as associate Director of Worship for the Diocese of Phoenix and has directed music and liturgy in parishes in Arizona and California, where he now presently resides. "In This Place" is one of his most popular songs. Our closing hymn, "We are Called to Serve" (Spirit Song, 139) was composed and written by Julie and Tim Smith, who are active in music ministry in the Diocese of Phoenix.

The Star Choir is now beginning rehearsals for the Holy Week and Easter liturgies. Do you like to sing, but cannot commit to being in the choir on a regular weekly basis but can possibly sing for a limited time? Perhaps joining the choir for Holy Week and Easter is a possibility for you. The Choir enjoys great fellowship and community and works diligently in its preparations for leading music in worship. The Choir rehearses Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m. Feel free to contact Star Music Minister Glenn Miller (g.miller@stargp.org) to learn more about the Choir.
