How is your journey this lent? Have you felt like you have been on a spiritual journey? Do you feel like you never started the journey? Been a bit bumpy? You don't know where the time has flown and now you realize Holy Week begins next Sunday and you kind of flubbed lent because of all the other distractions of life?

Well Lent is not over yet and there is always time to get back on track, to return to the Lord, to ask the Lord for help by letting Him know you are waking up a bit late. There is always time. Remember the Gospel of last Sunday, the parable of the prodigal father? The father is always looking and eagerly anticipating when his child would return home! So there is still time to open the heart, respond to the restlessness in your life and return back to the Lord for his mercy and peace. The verse of the Gospel acclamation this week is timely: "Even now says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart; for I am gracious and merciful."

As we approach the start of Holy Week next Sunday, may we be drawn into the dying and rising of Jesus. Whenever we hear the Word of God proclaimed at Mass, we are reminded that God does not and will not forget us! That is his promise to each one of us. God places his law in us and writes it upon our hearts. The question is, what is our response?

I suggest we all spend some extra time this week reflecting on the lessons we have learned about our individual selves this past year. What new insights do we have about our charity toward others, our care toward others, our care for ourself? How has my relationship grown, or diminished, the past year as things became lax? What is God asking me to do today now, at this time, at this point in my relationship with Him? If I have become weaker in my faith, what steps can I take to once again become stronger? How might I renew the practice of my religion through his Holy Week and through the Easter season? We still have these valuable days left in Lent to bring us back to the Lord, the one in whom we profess our life and hope for eternal life.

- \*\* One way to open the heart to the Lord is through confession or the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I have added some additional times for private confession this week: 1 pm Tuesday afternoon and 7 pm Thursday evening. Don't worry if you have not been in a while, I will help you through it! The "light is on for you" to lighten your load, leaved the baggage behind, and allow the Lord to bestow such generous mercy upon you!
- \*\* The special Alms Giving envelope can be returned any time if you will not be participating in Mass Holy Thursday evening. Thanks for your generosity!
- \*\* Notice the schedule for the upcoming Sacred Triduum liturgies here at Star of the Sea. These are the most power and unique liturgies of the year in the Church.
- \*\* Believe it or not, this Friday will be our last Fish Fry! It has been an amazing year! We have served 50% more dinners this year than any previous year. Your wonderful compliments have been uplifting and your suggestions helpful as well. Our team of volunteers make it all happen! As exhausting as it is for the core team of Debby Veltri, Brian Ebner and me, with the planning, shopping, cutting, mixing, and baking, we know the good produced by bringing the community together is priceless. 

Our opening hymn, "Again We Keep This Solemn Fast" (*Ritual Song,* no. 559) is a translation of the hymn, "Ex more docti mystico, which is attributed to Pope St. Gregory the Great. In the Roman Breviary this hymn is used in its

entirety for Matins (Morning Prayer) from the first Sunday in Lent until the Saturday before Passion Sunday. Today the hymn is used from Ash Wednesday until the Fifth Sunday of Lent, which is today.

Gregory was born around 540 in Rome. Although the Western Roman Empire had collapsed long before his birth, many ancient Roman families still commanded great wealth and influence in the city. Gregory was born into one such family. Gregory's family owned estates on the island of Sicily which provided income. He was well educated, excelled in all his studies, and became an expert in law. He excelled so much he became the Prefect of Rome, just as his father had been. After his father had died, he had the family villa in Rome converted into a monastery. Today the monastery still stands as the San Gregorio Magno al Celio.

Gregory was bishop of Rome from 590 until his death in 604. He is well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors. Throughout the Middle Ages, he was known as "the Father of Christian Worship" because of his exceptional efforts in revising the Roman worship of his day. He is one of the Latin Fathers and is a Doctor of the Church.

He may have also established "cantus planus," known in English as plainchant. Most today know this style of singing as Gregorian Chant. The melodious, monophonic music is known throughout the Church and closely associated with medieval monasteries. Gregorian chant gives us the oldest music we still have in the original form, some dating to the centuries just after the death of Gregory. It remains a matter of some dispute just how involved Pope St. Gregory was in the development of the style. Some music historians argue the credit is a misattribution that rightly belongs to his less famous successor of a century later, Gregory II.

Some quotes from Pope St. Gregory:

"We make Idols of our concepts, but Wisdom is born of wonder"

"Necessity demands that one should carefully examine who it is that comes to the position of spiritual authority; and coming solemnly to this point, how he should live; and living well, how he should teach; and teaching rightly, with what kind of self-examination he should learn of his own weakness."

"There are in truth three states of the converted: the beginning, the middle, and the perfection. In the beginning they experience the charms of sweetness; in the middle the contests of temptation; and in the end the fullness of perfection."

"The only true riches are those that make us rich in virtue. Therefore, if you want to be rich, beloved, love true riches. If you aspire to the heights of real honor, strive to reach the kingdom of Heaven. If you value rank and renown, hasten to be enrolled in the heavenly court of the Angels."

#### **Stewardship Thoughts**

The topic of conversion links today's Scripture passages. While in prison, St. Paul writes to the Philippian community: For His sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish. After His death, Resurrection, and Ascension, Jesus speaks forcefully to Paul on the road to Damascus. Paul experiences a profound conversion from his former life of sin, including the persecution of Christians. In his new life, the evangelist proclaims the Lord's message of salvation to the Gentiles. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus does not judge or condemn the woman charged with adultery, but asks her to sin no more and convert to a life free of this sin. A conversion from sinful ways produces a change of heart and mind, drawing us deeper into our discipleship with the Lord. As faithful stewards, we strive for a more intimate relationship with Christ. As we continue to progress through Lent, are we able to forgive those who have "trespassed against us," as Jesus asks, by communicating, forgiving, and reconciling with an estranged family member or friend?
