Saturday (April 30), Bishop Hanchon will be here to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon our 8th graders. Sunday, we have our celebration of Solemn First Communion. Congratulations to their parents, guardians, family members, teachers, catechists and all those who helped them to this memorable day. May they all continue to grow in their faith and their love for God, the Church, and all of God's people!
- ** Let us also pray, especially during these next two months, that our gradual moving into the "Family of Parishes" will be good, effective, and productive in the process of more effective pastoral ministry within our parishes in the central part of the SERF Vicariate. Our "family," which begins July 1, is St. Lucy, St. Joan of Arc, St. Veronica and St. Basil. While the pastors/priests will continue to primarily serve at their present ministry assignment, they will be part of the team responsible for the pastoral care of the whole family. More information will be forthcoming in the weeks ahead.

About today's hymns


Our opening hymn, **This Is the Feast of Victory** (*Ritual Song,* no. 583) is a paraphrase of Revelation 5: 9-10, 12-14, and 7:10b-12. It was composed in 1969 by American Lutheran composer Richard Hillert, it has since be-

come widely used during the Easter season. Hillert served as Professor of Music at Concordia College across four decades. He composed many liturgical works, including works for Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago.

Our preparation hymn, **You Walk Along Our Shoreline** (*Ritual Song*, no. 807) alludes to today's Gospel. It was written by Canadian Sylvia Dunstan, whose primary life's work was as a prison chaplain. A gifted writer, her love of liturgy sparked her prolific activities as a hymn writer before succumbing to liver cancer at the age of 38. She was first inspired to write hymns in the 1970's upon meeting Sister Miriam Winter, a Catholic Medical Mission Sister and hymn writer.

Our communion hymn, **You Satisfy the Hungry Heart** (*Ritual Song*, no. 912) was written as the official hymn of the Forty-First International Eucharistic Congress held in Philadelphia in 1976. Its author, Omer Westendorf, is generally acknowledged as the person most responsible for introducing hymnody in English to the American Roman Catholic Church in the post-Vatican II era. For over forty years he served as choir master and organist in his home parish, St. Bonaventure's, in Cincinnati. While stationed in Europe during World War II he was introduced to new liturgical musical settings and hymnody, and upon his return to the United States he founded a publishing company to bring much of this new European repertoire to American parishes in addition to repertoire by American composers.

Our closing hymn, **Worthy Is the Lamb** (*Spirit Song*, no. 166) is based on Revelation 5: 9-14, today's second lesson. Its author and composer, Fr. Ricky Manalo, is a Paulist priest, a composer, theologian, and author. He is the recipient of the 2020 Distinguished Catholic Music Composer of the Year Award by the Association of Catholic Publishers, and the 2018 Pastoral Musician of the Year Award by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians. He is known to compose in a variety of musical styles, from contemporary to traditional, and from Western classical to Asian pentatonic. He has written over 30 articles, books and chapters in books on a wide range of topics, including liturgy, culture, music, and the intersection of sociology and religious practices. As a missionary priest, Fr. Manalo has been to 6 of the 7 continents to do a variety of presentations, from academic lectures, keynotes, and pastoral workshops, to preaching, presiding, and giving concerts. His music has been sung during the Papal Masses of John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis. When he is not traveling throughout the world, he resides at St. Paul the Apostle Church in New York City.



Stewardship Thoughts

Discipleship connects today's Scripture passages. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter and his followers bravely witness Christ to the Sanhedrin. Privileged and honored to suffer for Jesus' name, they profess: We must obey God rather than men. They are not afraid of the price of discipleship, regardless of the cost. In the Book of Revelation, the angels praise the worthiness of the Lamb with honor and glory. St. John, in his Gospel, retells Jesus' post-Resurrection questioning of Peter. Christ asks Peter three times if he loves Him — some believe that was for each time Peter denied Jesus before His Passion and death. Peter responds with "yes" each time. Our invitation to discipleship begins at Baptism. We deepen our discipleship when we accept Christ's call to a personal relationship with Him, which begins the conversion process of mind to heart — making stewardship a way of life. The power of the Holy Spirit strengthens us to proclaim Christ and follow Him. Visit thewildgooseisloose.com for resources to develop a deeper relationship with the Holy Spirit.

Stop the Abortion Amendment!

A committee called Reproductive Freedom for All is working to amend the Michigan Constitution. Led by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, this committee's amendment would create a new unlimited and unregulated right to abortion in our state.

This radical proposal is not about reproductive freedom, which already exists.

This poorly-worded amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including laws unrelated to abortion. It could affect any law related to pregnancy and abortion and does not exempt minor children.

The following state laws are at risk:

- Parental consent for abortion
- Ban on school employees helping children have abortions
- Laws requiring parental consent for medical treatment related to pregnancy, including sterilizations and hormone therapy
- Late-term abortion bans
- Screening for women being coerced to have abortion
- Health and safety requirements for abortion facilities
- Requirement that only doctors perform abortion
- Conscience protections for doctors/nurses who object to abortions
- Ban on tax-funded abortions
- Michigan's original 1846 and revised 1931 abortion ban
- Bans on statutory rape and incest
- Prostitution ban
- · Ban on human cloning


