
MARRIAGE

About today's hymns:

Our opening hymn, **At the Lamb's High Feast We Sing** (*Ritual Song*, 578) is a revision of a seventeenth century Latin hymn, "Ad regis agni dapes" ("To the King's Lamb"). The hymn is a series of striking images of

Christ: he is at the same time the host of the feast (who provides the sacrifice – "gives his sacred Blood for wine, Gives his Body for the feast"), the priest (who offers the sacrifice – "Christ the priest"), and the victim ("Christ the victim.) The second stanza refers to the Passover story in Exodus 12 and 14 and to its Christian parallel in I Corinthians 5: 7-8. Stanza three speaks directly of Christ's conquering the powers of hell and death, opening the door to paradise, and stanza four concludes with a doxology to the Trinity.

Our hymn for the Preparation of Gifts, **The King of Love My Shepherd Is** (*Ritual Song*, 866), is a metrical paraphrase of Psalm 23 written by Henry Williams Baker, and English baronet and member of the clergy of the Church of England during the nineteenth century. As a churchman he was very "high church," which means he was very committed to liturgy that was very reverent and formal in style and engaged the senses, drawing on the ancient liturgical and spiritual practices of the church. He was practically minded in matters pertaining to the cultivation and nurture of one's devotional life, writing and publishing numerous devotional books as well as through editing hymnbooks. The tune *St. Columba* is named for St. Columba, who brought Christianity to Ireland and then Scotland in the sixth century.

Our closing hymn, **Sing with all the saints in glory** (*Ritual Song*, 565), is based on I Corinthians 15: 20 and was written by William Irons, a prominent English theologian during the nineteenth century. As a hymn writer he focused on providing hymns that specifically focused on the Gospel lessons prescribed by the lectionary. In addition to his significant contributions as a hymn writer, he published many sermons, letters, and pamphlets addressing the ecclesiastical and social controversies and issues of his time, including Darwinism, theism, education reforms, and poverty. The tune, *Hymn to Joy*, is the primary theme of the closing movement of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.

At the conclusion of the prelude at 9:30 the School Choir sings as a tribute to Mothers' Day, **From the Day You Were Born.** The text is an assurance of the presence of the God in one's life from the day one is born (and from conception) and through all times. The School Choir sings for the second Communion hymn, **Do you know the Shepherd's Voice**, the text of which quotes verses of Psalm 23. The Star Choir sings as the second Communion piece, **Shepherd of my heart**, a paraphrase of Psalm 23. The music is by Francis Patrick O'Brien, a priest of the Archdiocese of Boston who was ordained in 1985. He has spent all of his priesthood in parish and campus ministry, where, along with his sacramental and parochial duties, he has frequently served as music director and composer. He is currently pastor of St. Matthias Parish in Marlborough, MA, a western suburb of Boston. He began working in music ministry at age thirteen as accompanist for the children's choir in his home parish. He moved up the ranks from fill-in organist to music director while still in high school, and it was during those years that he began composing for liturgy.


Forthcoming musical events:

Stewardship Thoughts

A "shepherding" theme links today's Scripture passages. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas speak to the Jewish converts to Christ. A week later, they are persecuted for preaching again in Antioch — they turn to shepherd the Gentiles instead. In the Book of Revelation, the evangelist St. John wonderfully describes those who have persevered through great tribulation for the faith: For the Lamb who is in the center of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life-giving water. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus proclaims: My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. Sheep do indeed learn their shepherd's voice and follow him. As the Good Shepherd, Jesus continues to knock on the door of our hearts, inviting us to a deeper relationship with Him. Are we prepared to follow Christ, to accept His challenge of discipleship, whatever the cost, as we strive for eternal life? Consider encountering our Lord through **Eucharistic Adoration and** Benediction.

Stop the Abortion Amendment!

A committee called Reproductive Freedom for All is working to amend the Michigan Constitution. Led by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU, this committee's amendment would create a new unlimited and unregulated right to abortion in our state.

This radical proposal is not about reproductive freedom, which already exists.

This poorly-worded amendment would repeal dozens of state laws, including laws unrelated to abortion. It could affect any law related to pregnancy and abortion and does not exempt minor children.

The following state laws are at risk:

- Parental consent for abortion
- Ban on school employees helping children have abortions
- Laws requiring parental consent for medical treatment related to pregnancy, including sterilizations and hormone therapy
- Late-term abortion bans
- · Screening for women being coerced to have abortion
- Health and safety requirements for abortion facilities
- Requirement that only doctors perform abortion
- Conscience protections for doctors/nurses who object to abortions
- · Ban on tax-funded abortions
- Michigan's original 1846 and revised 1931 abortion ban
- Bans on statutory rape and incest
- Prostitution ban
- · Ban on human cloning

FORMING OUR FAITH

Why Should I enroll my child in Faith Formation Class??

For children and young people, religious education is where the parish accompanies parents on the journey of sharing the Gospel with their children and forming them as they grow into mature young Catholic Christians. It cannot be emphasized enough that the parents are the first, and best, teachers of their children. What you do in your home will echo down the years of the lives of your children. YOU are the Domestic Church! And the Our Lady Star of the Sea religious education program is here to help in this process.

The first task of religious education, at home and at the parish, is evangelization. That means developing a personal relationship with Jesus. Pope Francis put it this way in his letter "The Joy of the Gospel" --

"Jesus Christ loves you! He gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side, every day, to enlighten, strengthen, and free you."

When you were baptized, and when a child is baptized, by the Grace of God we receive the capacity to believe, what is known in Latin as "virtus fidei" -- the virtue of faith. But the Sacrament of Baptism is not magic. To grow in the Christian life, to become a true disciple of the Lord, requires explicit personal faith -- the "actus fidei" or "Act of Faith." Parents promise this on behalf of their children at baptism and it is their responsibility to help their children to "act on their faith" in accordance with age and maturity.

The parents are the first and best evangelizers of their children. The major sacramental moments that children experience -- First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation -- are important way stations on the journey of faith, but the journey doesn't end with them, it only begins.
