Catholic Services Appeal. It is that time of the year. The Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) has been the foundation for the many ministries and programs essential in the missionary activity in the Archdiocese of Detroit. These funded programs help to bring the message and action of Christ to those around us beyond our parish boundaries, but they also support many programs and efforts within our

parish. I think you all know well enough the "work" of the CSA. You also know that any funds raised beyond our target goal (\$165,000) this year is returned to the parish without any further assessment or future implications. For the past number of years, through your wonderful understanding and generosity in supporting the CSA, we have received back each year anyplace from \$15,000-\$60,000. In fact, many parishes use the CSA for specific fund raising because any money returned to the parish is "assessment free."

While I encourage you to make a pledge or gift to the CSA as in the past, I am asking for extra consideration in your generous donations to the CSA and the parish this year and the two subsequent years, 2023 and 2024.

It is that time in our parish history to replace roofs. You all know the importance of roofs. They are a necessity in order to keep everything inside, under the roof, safe, protected, and likewise prevent further, more expensive interior damage. You might not see what you give towards (like new windows, furniture, etc.) but without a good roof nothing else matters!

Our aim is to replace the lower school roof (and skylights) in the summer of 2023, the middle school and gym roofs in the summer of 2024, and the gathering space and church roofs in the summer of 2025. (When it comes to the church, we might also reupholster and refinish the pews.) With all these roofs, we have had many repairs especially over the past 5 years and even some of the patching is starting to "go."

Those who have kindly given to the CSA in previous years, your gift is again very much appreciated. An additional gift or pledge will be applied to the reroof fund. To those who have not given previously, would you kindly make a gift this year that will also be applied to the re-roof funds?? You can use the letter received from the Archdiocese of Detroit, the yellow band envelope in your packet, or any parish envelope. These can be placed in the offertory box or brought to the parish office. We are anticipating a total project cost of the three roof sections to be around \$2.2 million. Spreading out the work, and the fundraising time, over three years makes this endeavor more achievable. Thank you for your thoughtfulness and generosity!



About today's hymns

usic Notes

Wesley wrote over 6,000 hymns (some believe the number is closer to 6,500). This hymn actually is a parody of a secular song by John Dryden from the fifth act of his opera *King Arthur*. Wesley's reuse of this material was not an effort to take advantage of something new and trendy but an expression of his conviction that nothing was beyond redemption or could not be enlisted for God's purposes. The text is rich with scriptural allusions, including Philippians 2: 5-11, John 1: 14, Isaiah 57: 15, Psalm 106: 4, Deuteronomy 28: 65 (stanza 1); John 10: 10, Malachi 3: 1, I Corinthians 3: 16-19, Revelation 22: 3, and I Thessalonians 5: 17 (stanza 2); and II Corinthians 5: 17, Galatians 6: 5, II Peter 3: 14, Psalm 51: 12, Luke 2: 30, II Corinthians 3: 18, and Revelation 4:10 (stanza 3). The tune *Hyfrydol* (pronounced *huv-rod-ol*) is one of many fine Welsh tunes which have made their mark on hymnody. An interesting fact about this tune is that with one exception the melody lies within the first five notes of the scale, making it a very singable and easy tune to sing.

Our preparation hymn, **This Little Light of Mine** (*Spirit Song* 205) is a popular gospel song of unknown origin. It was often reported to be written for children in the 1920s by Harry Dixon Loes, but he never claimed credit for the original version of the song. The song takes its theme from some of Jesus's remarks to his followers. Matthew 5:14-16 gives "You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid. Neither do men light a candle and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it gives light unto all that are in the house. Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." At Confirmation on May 1 Bishop Hanchon sang this song at the conclusion of his homily.


Our communion hymn, **Holy Is Your Name** (*Spirit Song* 96), is a based on the Magnificat (Luke 1: 46-55), the Canticle of Mary. The Magnificat is one of the eight most ancient Christian hymns and perhaps the earliest Marian hymn. In Western Christianity, the Magnificat is most often sung or recited during the main evening prayer service: Vespers in the Catholic and Lutheran churches, and Evening Prayer (or Evensong) in Anglicanism. In Eastern Christianity, the Magnificat is always sung at Matins (Morning Prayer). The Magnificat echoes several biblical passages, but the most pronounced allusions are to the Song of Hannah, from the Books of Samuel (1 Samuel 2:1 –10). Scriptural echoes from the Torah, the Prophets, and the Writings complement the main allusions to Hannah's "magnificat of rejoicing". The tune *Wild Mountain Thyme* is a Irish/Scottish folksong.

Our closing hymn, **Hail, Holy Queen Enthroned Above** (*Ritual Song* 883) is a translation of the *Salve Regina, mater misericordia,* a <u>Marian hymn</u> and one of four <u>Marian antiphons</u> sung at different seasons within the <u>liturgical calendar</u>. The *Salve Regina* is traditionally sung at <u>Compline</u> (Night Prayer) in the time from the Saturday before <u>Trinity Sunday</u> until the Friday before the first Sunday of <u>Advent</u>. This English translation first appeared in *The Roman Missal* in 1884; the modern melody first appeared in 1736. The *Hail Holy Queen* is also the final prayer of the <u>Rosary</u>.





FORMING OUR FAITH

Why Should I enroll my child in Faith Formation Class??

For children and young people, religious education is where the parish accompanies parents on the journey of sharing the Gospel with their children and forming them as they grow into mature young Catholic Christians. It cannot be emphasized enough that the parents are the first, and best, teachers of their children. What you do in your home will echo down the years of the lives of your children. YOU are the Domestic Church! And the Our Lady Star of the Sea religious education program is here to help in this process.

The first task of religious education, at home and at the parish, is evangelization. That means developing a personal relationship with Jesus. Pope Francis put it this way in his letter "The Joy of the Gospel" --"Jesus Christ loves you! He gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side, every day, to enlighten, strengthen, and free you."

When you were baptized, and when a child is baptized, by the Grace of God we receive the capacity to believe, what is known in Latin as "virtus fidei" -- the virtue of faith. But the Sacrament of Baptism is not magic. To grow in the Christian life, to become a true disciple of the Lord, requires explicit personal faith -- the "actus fidei" or "Act of Faith." Parents promise this on behalf of their children at baptism and it is their responsibility to help their children to "act on their faith" in accordance with age and maturity.

The parents are the first and best evangelizers of their children. The major sacramental moments that children experience -- First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation -- are important way stations on the journey of faith, but the journey doesn't end with them, it only begins.
