- ** This **Thursday 7:30 pm** we will begin our Summer Outdoor Rosary at the Rosary Garden on Morningside. Bring a lawn chair if you like and join us every Thursday.
- ** Thank you for your sacrifices and donations to the Catholic Services Appeal. Through your gifts, you share in the education and formation of our future priests, lay ministers in the church, catechists, many social services, Right to Life initiatives, youth and young adult ministry, marriage and family ministry, media evangelization and assistance like "The Mass for Shut-Ins," various chaplaincies, and so much more. Your gift also helps priestly formation, like Fr. Brian Meldrum, helping us again this summer between his studies in Sacred Scripture at the Catholic University of America. Please remember, a gift or pledge to the CSA goes directly to more than 100 Catholic programs and ministries that share Christ with others.

As I wrote last week, we are using the CSA as the instrument to raise funds over the next three years in order to re-roof our lower school, middle school and gym, and the church. Beginning next summer, for three summers, a roof will be replaced. The excess money from our CSA target is returned to the parish and will be used for the re-roofing projects. We estimate this process might save us around \$70,000 that overwise would be assessed by the Archdiocese in a traditional fund raising campaign. So an extra gift this year will be applied to the re-roofing of our campus! Thank you for your generosity and sacrifices to make this happen.



About today's hymns

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, transferred from Thursday, May 26, forty days after Easter. The Ascension of the Lord is detailed in the Scriptures and in our creeds. Every Sunday, we profess it in the Nicene Creed. Jesus'

ascension concluded his work on earth to bring about our redemption that he began on Good Friday. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 662) "Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever." (no. 666)


Our opening hymn, Hail the Day that Sees Him Rise (Ritual Song 605) was written by the eighteenth century English hymn writer Charles Wesley with the title, "Hymn for Ascension Day." The tune is a typical Welsh tune in that it has a simple structure, with the first, second and fourth lines being exactly the same, making it very easy to learn and sing. The tune's name, Llanfair, is actually an abbreviation for one of the longest words in any language: Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwllllantysiliogogogoch, which means "Church of St. Mary in a hollow of white hazel near the rapid whirlpool of the Church of St. Tysillio by the red cave."

Our preparation hymn, A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing (Ritual Song 606) is a Latin hymn for the Ascension, and is attributed to the Venerable Bede, an eighth century monastic, scholar, and author. Bede's abilities and talents were clearly evident at an early age, and at the age of nineteen he was ordained a deacon, and became a priest at age thirty. His most famous work, The Ecclesiastical History of England, gave him the title "The Father of English History." Bede was a skilled linguist and translator, and his work made the Latin and Greek writings of the early Church Fathers much more accessible to his fellow Anglo-Saxons, which contributed significantly to English Christianity. Another important area of study for Bede was the academic discipline of computus, otherwise known to his contemporaries as the science of calculating calendar dates. One of the more important dates Bede tried to compute was Easter, an effort that was mired in controversy. He also helped popularize the practice of dating forward from the birth of Christ (Anno Domini – in the year of our Lord), a practice which eventually became commonplace in medieval Europe. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII declared him a Doctor of the Church. It is interesting to note that Bede died on Ascension Eve 735.

Each Sunday during this month we have included a Marian hymn in our liturgy as a part of having special devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary during the month of May, including the May Crowning. Today's communion hymn, Ave Maria (Ritual Song 896), is a setting of a paraphrase of the Hail Mary. According to Frederick Holweck, the May devotion in its present form originated at Rome where Father Latomia of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus, to counteract infidelity and immorality among the students, made a vow at the end of the eighteenth century to devote the month of May to Mary. From Rome, the practice spread to the other Jesuit colleges and thence to nearly every Catholic church of the Latin rite. In Rome by 1813, May devotions were held in as many as twenty churches. From Italy, May devotions soon spread to France. In Belgium, the May devotions, at least as a private devotion, were already known by 1803. The tradition of honoring Mary in a month-long May devotion spread eventually around the Roman Catholic world in the 19th century together with a month-long devotion to Jesus in June and the Rosary in October.

As this weekend is also Memorial Day weekend, our closing hymn is America the Beautiful (Ritual Song 965), which was written by Katharine Lee Bates, a professor of English literature at Wellesley College, Massachusetts. She was inspired to write this hymn when, in 1893 as she traveled to the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago she saw the vast wheat fields of the Midwest, and from there to Pike's Peak, where her soul was stirred by the expansive earth below and the spacious skies above.




