

We welcome this weekend to Our Lady Star of the Sea Fr. Jacek Cydzik, CSSR, of the Polish Redemptorists-Mission in Russia. This is part of the Archdiocese of Detroit Missionary Co-operative Plan. Each year (except for the past 2) a religious congregation, institute or diocese comes to our parish, coordinated by the Propagation of the Faith

Office. Through the coordinated effort of the Propagation of the Faith Office, each missionary entity is able to visit a small, medium, and large parish to make an appeal for their specific apostolic mission and ministry.

We will hear from Fr. Cydzik about work of the Polish Redemptorists and their 30 year history in the former Soviet Union. They presently have 5 pastoral centers in Russia, one in Kazakhstan, five in Belarus and two in Ukraine. Especially with the conflict in Ukraine, their missionary pastoral work is very important. There will be a second collection at each of the Masses, after communion, for their mission. You may also make a donation at next weekend's Masses as well, making the check out to *Our Lady Star of the Sea* and put in the memo line, "*Polish Redemptorists*." Thank you for your generosity.

- \*\* This Friday, July 1, brings about a change in our parish as we come together with the parishes of St. Basil and St. Veronica in Eastpointe, and the parishes of St. Lucy and St. Joan of Arc in St. Clair Shores as one family of parishes. I mentioned this change numerous times during the past two years. This new direction in the Archdiocese goes back to Synod 16 and the pastoral letter, Unleash the Gospel and how we can be open to the direction the Holy Spirit is leading us in our mission to bring the Gospel of Jesus to others. The pandemic also helped to bring this change to us sooner than later. The "family of parish" model is also anticipating the clergy shortage over the next 10 years, when we will have half the amount of priests presently serving in the Archdiocese. The focus with the family of parishes is this... there is a team of priests to pastorally care for the group of parishes. The priests have a "moderator" to help the whole process of ministers who are either "mission direct" or "mission support." Our moderator is Fr. Jim Commyn at St. Lucy parish. A year ago one half of the archdiocese became families. This Friday, the other half become families. Let us continue to pray for our parish, our family of parishes, and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit for all of us!
- \*\* Monday and Tuesday I will be joining all the other priests, half of the clergy in the archdiocese, for two days of meetings and prayer regarding our family of parishes. We will **not have Mass Tuesday morning here at Star of the Sea.** St. Joan of Arc and St. Paul will have their normal Mass schedule.
- \*\* Next weekend our second collection is for Peter's Pence, the annual collection for the Pope's charitable use around the world.

Jesus, Eternal High Priest, give us men willing to sacrifice and serve. Make their hearts after your own Sacred Heart.





#### Dear Parishioners

The Missionary Cooperation Plan helps to spread the gospel, build churches and communities around the world. This year I invite you to support the missionary work of Polish Redemptorists-Mission in Russia. We are working in the former Soviet Union for 30 years. At present, we have five pastoral centers in Russia, one in Kazakhstan, five in Belarus, and two in Ukraine.

This is an unpresidential time and we need to stand firm for peace working together to bridge the chasm created by war. The Polish Redemptorists with your help will be able to do so in a more efficient way. The COVID-19 pandemic held us back, but as a people of faith we look forward to the future believing that the best is still ahead of us.

As you can imagine, dealing with the aftermath of the war (helping refugees from Ukraine) and continuing to build much needed churches in Togliatti and Minsk is not an easy task.

Currently, over 200 Ukrainian refugees found shelter in our Redemptorists communities and parishes in Poland. You can only imagine how challenging must be the work of our fellow priests in Russia and Belarus. That's why your prayers and support are so much appreciated.

#### NORTHEAST REGION SERF VICARIATE

On Pentecost 2020, Archbishop Vigneron announced the next steps of the Archdiocese to move forward on mission: All parishes of the Archdiocese will join other parishes in new groupings called "Families of Parishes" -- working together and sharing resources, talents, even staffing and priests, in the coming years to further advance our shared mission to Unleash the Gospel.

The Archdiocese of Detroit is not alone in this situation. Most dioceses in the Midwest and Northeast are addressing this same issue, labelling the process by a variety of names. SERF is truly a microcosm of an increasingly challenging situation here in the Archdiocese. In the past decade, six of our parishes have formally closed, five parishes merged to two, leaving twelve communities which the Archdiocese anticipated might ultimately be grouped into four families. While serving as Vicar from 2016 - 2021, through discussion and consultation with other priests in the vicariate, a plan creating three families was approved and promulgated by Archbishop Vigneron in December 2020.

Key factors that prompted this restructuring include the former pattern of clustering and merging parishes has not proved to be the best solution. In addition, the number of available active priests is expected to be cut in half by the end of this decade. In 2020, 100 of the pastors in our 224 parishes were over the age of 65, two specifically in our family. Of the 6 priests assigned to our parishes presently, two are below the age of 50.

The COVID19 pandemic exacerbated the situation since four of our five parishes are considered a "single priest shop". New stress and strain has also been placed on both the human resources of staffing and volunteers as well as the financial resources to sustain the mission and the daily operations of our parishes.

All Families of Parishes will begin moving forward on July 1, 2022. The first phase will include intense collaboration, cooperation, and communication within the family as priests continue to shepherd their individual parishes while working toward particular family goals in a number of areas. Working jointly with lay leaders, conversations around Mission Direct and Mission Support will take place. New questions and particular challenges will be faced together. All of us must also share in creating a strong ecclesial family that can meet the growing diversity of needs within our broad community even as it continues to change.
