MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



Imagine flying over the United States in a small private plane at twilight tomorrow night. You could watch fireworks going off beneath you in all directions, as every town celebrates the birthday of the nation. They celebrate because, on July 4, 1776, the Declaration of Independence was announced publicly.

The Declaration was basically a list of the reasons why the 13 colonies had broken ties with their mother country, Great Britain. It was written by a committee headed by Thomas Jefferson. It stated that all people have a right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. By the time the Declaration was produced, the Revolutionary War had already been going on for some months. It would take eight years for the colonists to win the independence they prized so greatly.

Traditional celebrations for Independence Day include torchlight parades, bell ringing, picnics, family reunions, band concerts, and, of course, fireworks. It's a time for fun and a time for reflection, too. People give thanks today for a beautiful country and for a system of government that is admired all over the world.

Even in the United States, the poor and some minority citizens are often robbed of their basic rights. Frederick Douglass, the great anti-slavery writer, was once asked to give a speech on the Fourth of July. Pointing out that many African Americans were still held as slaves, he told those who had asked him to speak, "The blessings for which you on this day rejoice are not held in common."

Our bright celebrations this day are done in the hope that one day all will be free, that one day the earth itself will shine with liberty.

Jesus, Eternal High Priest, give us men willing to sacrifice and serve. Make their hearts after your own Sacred Heart.



Stewardship Thoughts

Today, the evangelist St. Luke retells in his Gospel of Jesus appointing and sending 72 laborers into the "field" the world — to spread the message of His Good News, much like the Harvest-Master sending workers into His harvest. Our Lord states: The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. This passage is often used to encourage the faithful to prayerfully consider a vocation to the priesthood, permanent diaconate, or consecrated life. Faithful stewards are called through Baptism, as disciples, to tend the Lord's vineyard and yield good fruit. In accepting this call, we return, in gratitude, a portion of our God-given gifts to serve the Church — to unleash the Gospel. To discover your talents, take a St. Austin Spiritual Gift inventory at churchdb.com/staustinsgi/staustinintro.asp, and then offer your talents and gifts to your parish.


