Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

Make their hearts after your own Sacred Heart.



# **Stewardship Thoughts**

The important theme of hospitality connects today's Scripture readings. In the Book of Genesis, Abraham's kindhearted hospitality to three unknown visitors results in Sarah and him being granted a son in their old age. Nothing is impossible with God. In St. Luke's Gospel, the evangelist narrates Martha's welcoming of Jesus to their home; she, though, complains to Christ when her sister, Mary, decides to listen to His teaching rather than help Martha serve the meal. Martha does not realize that Mary is extending hospitality to Jesus through her attentiveness. Hospitality is an important pillar of the threefold aspect of Hymns, Homily, and Hospitality promoted at the parish. The stewardship act of greeters welcoming those who enter the church before Mass expresses warmth and hospitality toward newcomers and parishioners alike. 



#### About today's hymns



Our opening hymn, "Gather your people" (Spirit Song, no. 111), is based on I Corinthians 12 and Isaiah 2: 3-4 and 11:9. It is by Bob Hurd, who has had a very active career as a teacher, composer, and liturgist in various pastoral and academic settings, includ-

ing Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, the Franciscan School of Theology in Berkley, St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, California, and most recently, Seattle University's School of Theology and Ministry. He began composing music shortly after Vatican II when the need arose for new music in the vernacular. He is also known as an early pioneer of bilingual and multilingual music. Now retired, his recent book, Compassionate Christ, Compassionate People (2019), reflects on his career as a teacher, author, composer, and pastoral musician.

Our preparation hymn, "I heard the voice of Jesus say" (Ritual Song, no. 768), is by Horatius Bonar, who lived in during the nineteenth century and was a member of a prominent Scottish family that had members among the clergy for two centuries or more. He was known from his profound scholarship, deep conviction, and great warmth, and wrote over six hundred hymns. His own title for this hymn was "The Voice from Galilee," and he indicated that it was based on John 1: 16: "And of his fullness have all we received, and grace for grace." Its tune, Kingsfold, is an English folk melody, and is named after a village near Horsham, England.

Our communion hymn, "In this place" (Spirit Song, no. 122), is by Trevor Thomson, who has worked as the associate director of worship for the Diocese of Phoenix and has also served parishes in Arizona and California.

Our closing hymn, "Lord of all hopefulness" (Ritual Song, no. 713), was written by Jan Struther, who is best known as the author of the World War II novel Mrs. Miniver (London, 1939) and the movie based on it. A celebrated writer, she contributed many articles, poems, and short stories to English periodicals, published five volumes of poetry, and was deeply involved in the preparation of the English hymnal, Songs of Praise, for which she wrote this hymn. This hymn was originally titled, "All-Day Hymn" as the shape of the daily cycle is carefully sketched out by key words at the end of each stanza. The tune, Slane, is of Irish folk origin, and is named for a hill about ten miles from Tara hill in County Meath, Ireland. It is on Slane hill, according to the account in the Confessions of St. Patrick, that the Irish saint defied the command of the pagan king Logaire by lighting the Paschal fire on Easter eve. St. Patrick was a fifth century Romano-British missionary and bishop in Ireland, and is the primary patron saint of Ireland. According to the autobiographical Confessio of Patrick, when he was about sixteen, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland, looking after animals; he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, he served as a bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland.
