About the choirs and choral tradition of England

With the passing of the Queen of England the world was given a front row seat in experiencing what is one of the greatest treasures of English church music and English music – its choir tradition – and the incredibly high standards and skills of the boys and girls that are choristers at the English cathedrals and major churches and university chapels. Often

times I am asked, "how is it that these young people sing and present themselves at such a high professional level?" The answer is that this is what they simply do every day of their school term, rehearsing normally twice a day on top of their regular school studies plus their musical instrument studies, and then singing in worship most days of the week plus on Sunday. In places such as Westminster Abbey, St Paul's Cathedral (which are both Church of England) and Westminster Cathedral (the Roman Catholic cathedral in London) the choristers sing approximately in worship four to five times on weekdays (Evensong in the Church of England institutions, and either Mass or Vespers or both in the Catholic cathedral), and then two to three times on Sundays. And what do they sing? In addition to the hymns, there are the psalms, canticles (such as the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis), responses, and anthems, and for Mass the Glory to God, the Creed, the Holy Holy, and the Lamb of God (normally in Latin in the Catholic cathedrals), plus a lot of Gregorian chant in the Catholic realm. That certainly is a lot of music!! Then there are the extra services and events, most notably this past week with all of the services for the Queen, and seasonal concerts, such as singing Handel's *Messigh* at Christmastime.

This tradition goes back nearly one thousand years and actually has its roots in temple worship in Old Testament times. The tradition as we know it today began in the monastic era of the Middle Ages, when schools were established by the monasteries for the boys in the town. Securing a place in the school was highly coveted, as it was a pathway out of poverty. While the tradition survived the English Reformation when monasteries were dissolved, there have been low points across the years, a far cry from the high standard that has been attained in the past one hundred and fifty years. While for centuries the choir school culture was almost exclusively male (there were in the Renaissance a few choir schools for girls), in the past fifty years this has changed, with boys and girls choirs existing now in most English cathedrals on equal footing.

The system is very much an apprentice system; in rehearsal the youngest and newest choristers are paired with older, senior choristers, and most of what is learned in how to read music and sing is learned by osmosis from the older choristers. They learn to think fast on their feet, how to focus, the essentials of self-discipline, what it means to be a part of a team, and simply how one must get on with simply doing what needs to be done in the moment, all skills which will carry them through life whether or not they pursue music as a career. All along the way they learn and value the great culture which has been passed down from generation to generation.

I personally have had a brush with this tradition in my own singing career on both sides of "The Pond," singing on occasion as one of the professional men at both St Paul's in London and at St Thomas, New York City. Because of the skill level that the choristers attain, it isn't necessary to spend a lot of time in rehearsal learning the notes as one must simply read in the moment what is on the pages of the music. I'll never forget when one week I was singing at St Paul's in the summer we had a particularly heavy load, with three nights of recording sessions, singing the Beethoven *Mass in C* with full orchestra for Sunday morning mass, and then the following Tuesday singing in concert the Brahms *Requiem*. While some of this music recurs on the music schedule over the course of a year or the course of one's time in the school, a good amount of it wasn't on the schedule over the course of the preceeding year. We only had three rehearsals to get the Beethoven in shape for Sunday, third rehearsal being the rehearsal with orchestra, and then on Saturday, Monday and Tuesday had to get the Brahms in shape. The choristers didn't think there was anything super-human about this feat, and just did it. Children at that age are simply like sponges, and learn these skills with ease. It's like how easy it is for children to learn computer skills.

While England is perhaps best known for this culture, it is also a tradition that has been passed down in churches in continental Europe, including the Sistine Chapel Choir at the Vatican (the Pope's personal choir), the Regensburg Cathedral Choir (whose one time director was the brother of Pope Benedict XVI), Notre Dame, Paris, and the Thomaskirche in Leipzig, Germany (whose one time director was Johann Sebastian Bach). In our own country this tradition has been established and is thriving at such Roman Catholic institutions as the Cathedral of the Madeleine in Salt Lake City, where the cathedral's school was re-formed about thirty years ago into a proper choir school, modelled after the Choir School of Westminster Cathedral, London, where all its students (approximately 250) sing in a choir each and every day, and the St Paul's Choir School, Cambridge, Massachusetts. In the Anglican tradition the standard in our country is the St Thomas Choir School, New York City, which has a residential choir school modelled after the residential choir school at Westminster Abbey. There presently is a Grosse Pointe connection with the St Thomas Choir School, as the son of the Director of Music at Christ Church Grosse Pointe is a third year student at the school and member of the choir.

So it really comes as now surprise how the choristers which sang at the Queen's funeral services did what they did with such ease and poise, as this is what they do each and every day. Still, singing for Her Majesty's funeral services was the pinnacle moment of their choir school career for each and every chorister, a memory that they will never forget. It is a tradition of beauty which truly speaks to and melts and comforts the hearts and souls of all that experience it, an anchor which keeps us all grounded on the sea of life, and a portal to the glorious music that awaits in heaven. Contrary to what one may think when one sees what they do in their choirs, these children are normal children who love to play, can be full of mischief, engage in sports, play video games, whatever, but because of their environment are able to do extraordinary things, all to the glory of God.



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We are less than two months from the November 8 election, during which voters in Michigan will decide on an issue of paramount importance to protecting the inherent, God-given dignity of all people.

Abortion advocates under "Reproductive Freedom For All" seek to amend the state constitution to allow unregulated abortion ondemand through all nine months of pregnancy. This effort, primarily funded by out-of-state dollars, is spearheaded by Planned Parenthood and the ACLU. It will appear on the ballot as Proposal 3.

The implications of this proposal are vast and extreme. If passed, the proposal's vague wording would result in the elimination of dozens of Michigan laws relating to abortion, including: laws prohibiting partial-birth abortion and taxpayer-funded abortion; laws requiring parental consent and informed consent for abortion; laws protecting the conscience rights of persons who refuse to participate in abortion, and more. The proposal would prohibit lawsuits from being brought against any individual for performing an abortion, even when complications result from the procedure.

Proposal 3 is not about protecting existing rights, but rather about revoking the right to life for an untold number of human beings.

This is a grave offense to the dignity and sanctity of unborn, innocent human life. As people of faith who witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ and His teachings, we fervently oppose this deadly proposal and are taking action to defeat it. On behalf of the Catholic dioceses of Michigan, including the Archdiocese of Detroit, the Michigan Catholic Conference earlier this year partnered with Right to Life Michigan and other pro-life organizations to form a coalition called **Citizens to Support MI Women and Children** to oppose and, ultimately, to defeat this dangerous proposal.

In support of these efforts, I offer you three invitations to act:

PRAY: As advocates for the sanctity of life and truth, we always begin with prayer. Let us pray that our fellow Catholics and all people of goodwill will reject Proposal 3 in recognition of the danger it poses for women, children, and their families. To assist in our prayer, I will be celebrating Mass at 11 a.m. October 2 at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament, in gratitude to the Sacred Heart of Jesus for the gift of all human life. I hope to see you there.

VOTE: As faithful citizens, we look forward to casting our votes on November 8. Catholics in the Archdiocese of Detroit are called to uphold the inherent dignity of all people by voting against Proposal 3, rejecting its "anything goes" approach to the destruction of human life. To vote in favor of this proposal would be to actively participate in the promotion and expansion of the intrinsic moral evil of abortion.

GIVE: As members of a family of faith, we can spread awareness among Catholics, practicing or otherwise, and others about the true nature of Proposal 3 and its consequences for life, women, families, and children. You can do this in part by discussing it with family, friends, and members of your community, but your reach will grow exponentially through your support of the statewide coalition dedicated to preventing this proposal from distorting our state constitution. I invite you to visit https://supportmiwomenandchildren.org/ to learn more about the amendment, view a list of the dozens of laws it would impact, and consider a financial contribution to these efforts.

As we protect and defend life from the moment of conception through natural death, we must at the same time accompany and support women experiencing difficult or unintended pregnancies. That is why the pro-life office of the Archdiocese of Detroit is working with our parishes and Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan, the charitable arm of the archdiocese, to redouble efforts to provide assistance and resources to women and families across the region, especially through initiatives like **Walking With Moms in Need** (https://www.aod.org/walking-with-moms-in-need). We cannot create a world where abortion is unthinkable without also creating a world in which all families receive the support they need. This work of mercy is critical and continuous. Together, we are building a culture of life where vulnerable families are given the help and support they need to choose and sustain life. Please join me in praying that this destructive proposal is defeated, and that Catholics and others use their votes to uphold the right to life and the inherent dignity of all people. Let us always have confidence in Jesus Christ, who has triumphed over death and invites us to this work of accomplishing God's will in our midst.


