Opposing Proposal 3

This November, Michigan voters will be asked to consider Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal), which would amend Michigan's Constitution to make abortion a fundamental right. As Catholics, we recognize that "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely

from the moment of conception." (CCC 2270). That is because every person is wonderfully made in the image and likeness of God and is therefore of immense worth. But we must also help our family members, friends, and neighbors understand that Proposal 3 goes much farther than merely restoring Roe v. Wade's abortion regime. In fact, Proposal 3 invalidates more than two dozen Michigan pro-life laws and has many startling consequences. For example, the proposal grants a fundamental right to reproductive freedom to "every individual"—with no age limits. So on its face, the proposal authorizes a minor to obtain an abortion without parental consent or even notice, even though a parent's consent is always required to dispense medicine or perform the most routine medical procedure for a minor. Proposal 3 supporters say that courts can put limits on this broad language. But that's not true. A judge interpreting the Michigan Constitution must apply the words that the Constitution contains, and that means courts will be required to give effect to the broad phrase "every individual." No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Michigan's Constitution should not be amended to strip parents of their right to be consulted before a minor child makes the serious decision to take her baby's life. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th. John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Through Alliance Defending Freedom, he represents the Michigan Catholic Conference and Right to Life of Michigan in court to uphold Michigan's pro-life laws.

In the above article, we discussed how Proposal 3 (the "Reproductive Freedom for All" proposal) would amend Michigan's Constitution to make abortion a fundamental right, contrary to the Catholic Church's teaching that life must be protected from the moment of conception. We also learned that Proposal 3 goes much farther than merely codifying Roe v. Wade, invaliding more than two dozen Michigan pro-life laws and authorizing minors to obtain abortions without a parent's consent or even notice. But there's more. Proposal 3 defines "reproductive freedom" in a breathtakingly broad manner, to include "sterilization." And again, because Proposal 3 grants this right to "every individual," without age limits, that means the proposal, on its face, authorizes a minor to obtain a sterilization without parental consent or even notice, such as when a minor desires to change his or her gender. In addition, Proposal 3 authorizes every possible kind of abortion procedure, defining "reproductive freedom" to include "abortion care." Such language authorizes gruesome procedures like partial-birth abortion, where a child is partially delivered before an abortionist takes the baby's life. No matter how a voter feels about abortion, Michigan's Constitution should not be amended to strip parents of their right to be consulted before a minor child makes the serious decision to undergo a sterilization procedure, nor should the Constitution authorize partial-birth abortions. Please tell everyone you know: vote "NO" on Proposal 3 on November 8th. John Bursch is a constitutional lawyer and former Michigan Solicitor General. Music Notes About today's hymns

from Glenn Miller

Our opening hymn, "Come, Holy Ghost" (*Ritual Song*, no. 611) is attributed to Hrabanus Magnentius Maurus, a ninth century Frankish Benedictine monk,

theologian, poet and military writer who became the archbishop of Mainz. He was the author of the encyclopedia *De rerum naturis* ("On the natures of things") and also wrote treatises on education and grammar and commentaries on the Bible. He was one of the most prominent teachers and writers of the Carolingian age, and was called "Praeceptro Germanias", or "the teacher of Germany." Born of noble parents, after his education at the Benedictine Abbey of Fulda and at Tours, where he studied under Alcuin, he became principal of the Fulda Abbey school, which under his direction became one of the most pre-eminent centers of scholarship and book production in Europe. In 814 he was ordained a priest, but shortly thereafter, apparently on account of disagreement with his abbot, he was banished from Fulda. Upon the election of a new abbot he returned, and in time he himself became abbot, resigning in 842 to have a quieter life for study and prayer. He returned to public life when he was elected archbishop of Mainz in 847. He is regarded as the father of the modern system of education in Germany.

The tune is by Louis Lambillotte, a nineteenth century Belgian Jesuit, composer and palaeographer of Church music. Lambillotte played a primary role with the restoration of Gregorian chant through his extensive scholarship, gathering and comparing all the Gregorian chant documents that were to be found in the Jesuit houses as a result of his visiting and re-visiting almost every country of Europe, exploring libraries in search of the most ancient manuscripts of chant and all treatises bearing on the history or theory of chant. Lambillotte was born in 1796. After extensive musical studies as a youth and serving as organist in a couple of churches, he was appointed in 1820 choirmaster and organist of the Jesuit College in Amiens. While serving there he studied classics and in 1825 entered the Society of Jesus and subsequently devoted himself to composing music for both for religious ceremonies and academic entertainments.

Our preparation hymn, "We Walk by Faith" (*Ritual Song*, no. 723), connects us with today's Gospel lesson. It was written by Henry Alford, a nineteenth century priest who concluded his career as dean of Canterbury Cathedral. He published forty-eight books, and is best known for his translation of the Greek Testament. He also was a musician and a composer. The tune is by Marty Haugen, a well-known contemporary composer of liturgical music in America.

Our communion hymn, "Eye Has Not Seen" (*Ritual Song*, no. 758), was both written and composed by Marty Haugen. The text is based on 2 Corinthians 2: 9-10.

Our closing hymn, "Lead Me, Guide Me" (*Ritual Song*, no. 712), was written by Doris Mae Akers, and comes from the African American gospel hymn tradition. Akers contributed some of the most notable gospel songs of the second half of the twentieth century. Born in Brookfield, Missouri, as one of ten children, she demonstrated her interest in music at the young age of six, teaching herself to play the piano by ear. By age ten, she had composed her first song, and by age twelve she had organized a five-piece jazz band. When she was told that she possessed a "magic" ability to capture the attention of a congregation, Akers dismissed it saying, "Magic, nothing—it's just letting go and releasing the Spirit of God." This hymn is based on Psalm 5: 8 and 4: 8, and refers to Jesus is one's companion. Stanza 1 acknowledges our need for Christ's "strength and power" during our "weakest hour." In stanza 2, "Satan and sin" attempt to lead us away from the "paths of righteousness." In stanza 3, the poet confesses that she is "lost" without Christ's "hand" and "blind" without "thy Light to see." The theme is reinforced by the last line of each stanza, "Lead me, O Lord, lead me," which segues into the refrain.



The Parish needs some new lectors to serve along with our existing team of dedicated lectors.


Do you read aloud well? We'd love for you to share your gift for reading aloud with us by proclaiming the Word during Mass.





Stewardship Thoughts

The topic of faith connects today's Scripture passages. In both the First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Habakkuk and St. Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, the sacred writers proclaim that faith and patience are necessary to withstand hardships and struggles. Because of his professing faith in Christ to the people, St. Paul writes this Second Letter to Timothy from prison. In St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus declares to his Apostles that belief the size of a mustard seed can uproot a mulberry tree and plant it in the sea. In other words, just a minute amount of faith is very powerful. Being a disciple of the Lord demands both faith and trust. Faith is God's gift to us. How do we, as Christian stewards, increase faith and trust in our Lord and Savior? Begin each day with a few minutes of prayer and include some verses of Scripture reading.
